

These are the sort of things you might know if you're a telephone enthusiast or a "phreaker" (someone who hacks the phone system). If any of this interests you, you might like the upcoming Telephone Collectors International Phone Show in Lancaster, PA which will be 8th-9th June 2018. This show will not only feature actual telephones from across the last 100 years, but also something called "Switcher's Corner" for those geeks (like me) that enjoy the backend (i.e. central office) of the telephone network. Today, with free software like asterisk, you can power a telephone switch on your own home computer as a background process or even on a Raspberry Pi (a computer the size of a deck of playing

cards!) You can run hundreds of SIP phones with voice mail and calling features for free – something that used to cost thousands of dollars for most businesses to operate. If you like the old hardware, one member even has a working crossbar-5 in his basement (photo left).

Motorcycle-Only Checkpoints Suck! Here's how to avoid them.

As riding season approaches, it's important that you are aware of and use The New York Motorcycle & Scooter Task Force's Twitter feed which reports motorcycle-only checkpoints.

Subscribe to https://twitter.com/NYMSTF and ensure you enable text messages for this Twitter feed! You can also report any Motorcycle-Only Checkpoints to the NYMSTF by texting them. We're all in this together – let's avoid being pulled over and having impromptu safety inspections!

Some history: The motorcycle-only checkpoints or MOCs started in 2007 as simple revenge. In April of 2006, New York State Police Trooper Craig J. Todeschini attempted to chase down a reckless speeder on a motorcycle. His police-issued 4WD Chevy Tahoe SUV simply wasn't the right tool to chase down a 1000cc sport bike. His zeal exceeded his skills and the capabilities of his equipment, and he died when he lost control of his truck and struck a tree during the chase.



Not long afterward, a law was named after the deceased NYSP Trooper that created a new category of offense called "unlawful fleeing." Of course, fleeing was already unlawful but that's typical politics. Try to solve a problem by making an illegal thing more illegal.



So, a law was passed prohibiting unlawful fleeing. James Carncross, already on probation for grand larceny, was quickly apprehended, tried for and convicted of aggravated criminally negligent homicide, and sentenced to a minimum of seven years in jail for the part he played in Todeschini's death. You would think that would more or less be the end of it. You would be wrong.

Response to this incident by the NYSP, which was widely acknowledged in law enforcement circles and elsewhere as categorical retaliation against motorcyclists, was fairly prompt. Less than a year and a half after Todeschini's death, the country's first-ever motorcycle-only checkpoint – named "Operation 5060" in the memory and honor of Todeschini's badge number – was conducted on I-84 in East Fishkill, New York by the NYSP and led by then- Sergeant J. Halvorsen. This operation was a pilot – a blueprint for things to come.






