

Boy Jack the Bootblack's Back Story

I can't even describe how discovering leather and motorcycling changed my life! Even more so, it was a fluke! I have been "out" since I was 14, and I started checking out the scene at 21. You would think that since we're all under the same marginalized rainbow, we would be more brotherly and empathetic to each other. Sadly, that was the *furthest thing* from the truth (from my experience). I was over 200lbs (91kg) and I had no abs, no fashion sense (I still don't) and no confidence. If you didn't have the perfect Adonis body, the trendiest fashions, and the right amount of money in the bank, you "didn't belong" in the gay world. The plethora of "Next", "Out", "Odyssey" and other magazines strewn with nearly-nude gym bunnies did not help in the slightest. For years, I struggled with my weight and sense of being a part of something bigger than myself. I was even in a relationship sole for the sake of being in one. That didn't help, either.



Around 2012, and after dropping almost 60lbs, I started getting more

involved in the community. I started volunteering at SAGE, and attending more gay social events, notably gay gaming groups and the New York Bear Den (NYBD). A year later, my life truly began to change.

Chaz (of Empire City MC) and I got briefly acquainted at the NYBD, but we never got to know each other beyond the basic niceties. Around May 2013, I received an e-mail from him asking if anyone wanted to join his motorcycle club for its annual Memorial Day weekend ride up to "The Ranch" in Rochester. It turns out, he accidentally sent the email to both NYBD and Empire City Motorcycle Club (ECMC), of which, he was president at the time. Being up for new opportunities, I inquired about joining; my emails between Chaz and I went something like this:

Me: "I'd love to go, but I have <u>never</u> ridden on a motorcycle before. Is it possible to ride the back of someone else's bike?" Chaz: "How much do you weigh?"

Me: 155 lbs (This was back in the day, and he didn't know I was messaging him.) Chaz (Finally realizing who it was): "I'll take you for a trial ride on the back of my bike, and we'll see how you like it."

So we took a ride around parts of NJ and upstate, stopping for ice cream at Haverstraw (we both <u>love</u> ice cream and we continue to bond over it). Three hours later, he dropped me off in the city, at which I responded, "We're done already?" Also, a lady in the cab behind us stuck her head out the door and vomited all over the street (Gotta love NY! The city's just so alive!). Regardless, he knew I was ready. So, we took the eight-hour ride up; this whole time, I'm shaking nervous. I don't know anyone else, and I don't know what to expect. Then again, that's what taking chances is all about. I was welcomed with open arms and shown a home where men can be men. We broke bread, kicked back a few, and just palled around. It was the first time in my life I had felt comfortable being my own man who happens to be gay.



Since then, more opportunities opened; I got my passport for my first trip to Canada, I got my driving license after failing my test when I was 17 and I purchased a motorcycle. The journey hasn't always been easy; I've laughed, cried, made great decisions, and not-so-great decisions. However, I've learned through it all. I've travelled and met men who taught me to "remember your worth, and don't let anyone make you feel otherwise" (that includes myself). My colours are decked with pins and patches full of stories I've listened to, and every leather event as made me a better man than I was yesterday. Aside from leather, I've been inspired to get the most out of life; I've been shown how to be a successful man and how to have a healthy relationship. I would even go as far to say that I wouldn't get married unless I saw my relationship emulated most of the couples I've met. Most

importantly, I've learned the definition of "family." I have chosen brothers and even chosen fathers all across the country with whom I can talk to and spend time; I can always count on them for advice and the occasional kick in the ass. I'm the first to admit I need to be checked time-to-time.

I've found a leather daddy whom I think the world of, and I've been more comfortable with myself physically, emotionally, mentally, and sexually. I don't know where the journey will lead me, but I can't wait to get there. Love, leather, respect, and big hugs! I'll see you on the road.

I came out during my junior year up there and there was very little support for gay culture. The only time I've ever been mugged in my 72 years has been in Rochester while exiting a gay bar.


