



MAGA: Anti-Gay/Anti-Drag/Anti-Trans/Anti-Women

More than 300 drag performers and allies gathered in Tallahassee on 24th April to protest a slew of bills that take aim at the LGBTQ+ community, now moving fast through Florida's statehouse.

In polished pumps and a sea of red T-shirts that read "The show must go on," the effervescent crowd marched half a mile from Cascades Park to the Capitol building, brandishing signs bearing pleas for protection.


They rallied in Tallahassee "to protest against continued attacks on the LGBTQIA+ community by Gov. DeSantis and other Republican state legislators."

Tuesday afternoon against recent legislation that organizers say is attacking the LGBTQ community. The rally drew advocates from across the state to Tallahassee for a march to the state Capitol, where speakers included state Sen. Shevrin Jones.

EZPass Enforcement Actions

MTA Bridge and Tunnel officers seized the vehicles of 63 drivers who owed a combined \$1.5 million in unpaid tolls in their latest crackdown, officials said Wednesday. A man is taken into custody at the Verrazzano-Narrows Bridge on 11 April 2023.

The two-day blitz targeted scofflaws on the Verrazzano-Narrows Bridge on Tuesday and the Bronx-Whitestone Bridge last Thursday. The worst offender was a Lexus RX4 driver stopped on the Verrazzano who owes \$86,111.82 in tolls and fees, according to the MTA, which calculated the debt down to the exact cent. The runner-up was a 1998 Honda Accord driver who owes \$66,763.02, the MTA said. The drivers' vehicles were towed, and their registrations have been recommended for suspension by the state DMV.

"In a perfect world, everyone pays their tolls – their fair share," said Richard Hildebrand, the VP and chief of operations for Bridges and Tunnels, in a statement.

During the latest crackdown, another driver was arrested and charged with possession of a forged instrument for trying to cross the Verrazzano in a Mercedes-Benz SUV with a fake Georgia license plate.

In January, Bridge and Tunnel officers busted 17 drivers at the Verrazzano with a total of \$420,000 in unpaid tolls and late fees. One driver owed nearly \$60,000.

Last year, the vehicles of 1,800 toll violators were intercepted at MTA bridges and tunnels. Those scofflaws accounted for tens of millions of dollars owed to in tolls and fees, the agency said. A driver was busted with fake Georgia plates at the Verrazzano-Narrows Bridge on April 11, 2023. The MTA said it's expanding its crackdowns on toll scofflaws at bridges and tunnels.

Drivers skipping out on paying tolls at MTA tunnels and bridges should be aware that transit authorities are cracking down.

Bridge and Tunnel officers pulled over 17 people at the Verrazzano-Narrows Bridge on Wednesday "for continuous toll evasion," the MTA confirmed.









According to the agency, the drivers had crossed the bridge "scores of times" while ignoring their toll bills, accumulating a total of \$420,000 in unpaid tolls and late fees. One driver owes nearly \$60,000.

The officers seized their cars from the bridge and impounded them. Twelve additional vehicles were also seized at area crossings in the past day, officials said.

The impacted drivers were allowed to continue their journeys without their vehicles.

EZPass and Motorcycles

If you remember correctly, the last few years we've been trying to gather affected persons for a class action lawsuit against EZPass because they occasionally misclassify our motorcycles as trucks or other vehicles, and/or in some cases, fail to read our EZPass tags resulting in a higher "midrange" toll. We never got enough parties in our class action lawsuit and we have dropped it without prejudice, which means we could kick it back off again at anytime should we choose.





Due to the nature of the way the EZPass system will penalise somebody if their transponder is not read properly but the number tag is (midrange tolling), our road captain recommends the following for motorcycle use: Remove your EZPass transponder and place it in a faraday bag in your pocket when you travel. We recommend the telephone-sized faraday bag from https://godarkbags.com/ (Please note: The bag in which your transponder arrives which is allegedly a faraday bag is not a faraday bag!)

Why are we recommending use to your transponder? Since MTA/Thruway have put in cameras and have removed toll gates from all toll plazas, let their cameras capture your motorcycle licence tag as it should. Oops? Motorcycles have only one number tag (therefore, a 50% chance less of being read than a car), motorcycles have smaller tags (harder to read/capture), also travel bags, luggage racks and other items sometimes obscure your number tag from cameras, but not from plain view! Avoid intentionally covering your plate in a manner that looks like it was done intentionally! Place a jacket on your luggage rack bag and if the sleeves happen to cover the number tag with the bungee cord, oh well: plausible deniability.

A word of warning: DO NOT obscurify your number tag as that's what the police are looking for when you cross the bridge in the crackdowns you see above. Obscureification includes: covering up your number tag, positioning it in an "illegal manner" (i.e. under the wheel well, bent up/folder, mounting vertically rather than horizontally, placing items that block your number tag intentionally such as a leaf, or other items like a sticker. Make sure if you are covering up your plate in any way that it's completely and totally A manner in which you have plausible deniability so you can apologise and avoid a ticket. Of course, pay your EZPass bill in full so they have nothing to nab you on.

If the cameras luck out and actually capture your number tag, that's OK because they will cross reference it with your easy pass tag and you will get a discount from the full fare, paying the same price as midrange. I have been personally riding like this for the past few years and I can report that I am only charged tolls in New York State about 30% of the time but in New Jersey I'm paying 70% of my tolls through the automated system. I guess their cameras are better in New Jersey.

Due to distance from New York City, we split the ride there and back into two days; however, you can meet up with us anywhere along the route!

We'll spend a night in Harrisburg, PA as our half-way point on our ride to way to Coal Centre. On the return, we'll stay over in Philadelphia, having brunch in Philadelphia, returning to NYC on Tuesday. You may join up with us anywhere along the route! Note: Hotel reservations, dinners/drinks in Harrisburg/Philadelphia are not included in the run fee. This is to allow the most flexibility for those wishing to participate:
