At our 50th anniversary in 2014, "Evil Ed" C was our president. His husband was Tony. With all the rides and events to celebrate our 50th anniversary, we knew we were going to depend on our spouses and boyfriends to help with the heavy lifting.

History: The boyfriend or husband of the president of most gay "MCs" (includes nonriding clubs) is referred to as the T.F.L. (The First Lady). It was common that "tif-ills" (TFLs) would host a "TFL Tea" cocktail party for all TFLs present at most runs.

We created an unofficial group called the "ECMC Ladies Auxiliary" of all the people that were helping us make our 50th anniversary special. Most them were pillions (people who ride on the back seat). We even had special T-shirts made-up for the parade for the people carrying our banner that year! We've referred to this ancillary group of people that hang out and help us with all of our work to be the "Ladies Auxiliary" in a kind-hearted way. Every year, K.K. Seeks out volunteers to act as marshals to walk along with the motorcycles, Keeping them aligned and safe. But this year one of the marshals who's helped us for years went and had a bunch of our ECMC T-shirt designs printed on pink T-shirts for our marshals! We were simply amazed with how much love an admiration they showed us!











Trans Visibilty - Project Sidewalk Chalk

Empire City MC has a recent reputation of causing trouble with sidewalk chalk. Just days before the Stonewall Pride March in New York City, the federal government who is in charge of the Stonewall National Monument (and park) on Christopher St decided to tarnish our history and try to eradicate and erase queer and trans people from our collective histories. They removed the famous statues from the park and they also took down all references to queer and trans including the trans flags that used to fly there. Currently, Empire City has no trans members, but we have trans friends. We will not let them erase them.



So, we got to work to stand up for our friends. We bought 50 sticks of pink white and blue sidewalk chalk and set out to recruit people to put trans flags all over the streets and sidewalks surrounding the Stonewall National Monument.

We were surprised when dozens of people showed up to help and one couple brought actual trans flags and heavy duty zip ties to put trans flags back up on the fence surrounding the park. Many remained in place throughout the parade!

We did this the night before the parade was to take place. We did this because it's a highly visible highly photographed area during the parade. We sincerely hope that everybody follow in our footsteps and not cower down to the administration that sees itself as a legitimate monarchy in our free country. Speak up, take action, show support to others!

We seem to have started a trend! Additional trans flags have been showing up on sidewalks and roadways around New York City since our project took place!

It might be simple but it's a clear message that trans people are people and will not be going away!

New Tax Deduction for American-Made Motorcycle Purchases

Great news for motorcycle enthusiasts! The recently passed H.R. 1 legislation, often dubbed the "Big Beautiful Bill," includes a significant provision benefiting those who buy new motorcycles made or assembled in the United States. According to the Motorcycle Riders Foundation, the **interest paid on loans for qualifying new motorcycle purchases will now be tax-deductible.**

This new deduction is "above-the-line," meaning it reduces your adjusted gross income (AGI) before your taxable income is calculated. This is a big win because it makes the deduction available to most taxpayers, even those who don't itemize.

Here are the key details:

- Cap: The deduction has a cap of \$10,000.
- Income Phase-Outs: The benefit phases out as income levels increase.
- Qualifying Vehicles: The vehicle must be "manufactured primarily for use on public streets, roads, and highways" and includes cars, minivans, vans, SUVs, pickup trucks, and motorcycles.
- Temporary Policy: This policy is temporary, expiring in 2028.

The Motorcycle Riders Foundation, advocating for street riders in Washington, D.C., applauds this tax provision, seeing it as a policy that supports both the growth of motorcycling and American manufacturing. If you're considering a new bike in the next three years, research how this new policy might benefit you!

No Kings Protest

The current political climate is causing alarm. There's been a recent announcement of 60 new "concentration camps" planned for construction across the United States, reminiscent of facilities like "Alligator Alcatraz" in Florida. Furthermore, the sitting President has reportedly considered revoking the citizenship of a naturalized U.S. citizen and deporting him, simply because he's running for mayor of New York City and hasn't aligned with the President's wishes.



These actions draw unsettling parallels to historical events presently in Moscow and post-WWI Nazi Germany. While protests are escalating nationwide, there's a concern that too many people remain complacent, potentially waiting until it's too late to act.

During a recent "No Kings" protest in Chattanooga, TN, as part of a nationwide event, it was inspiring to witness everyday citizens workers, teachers, and retirees—gathering in the public square to voice their unequivocal opposition to current government actions. The path to the mid-term elections will be challenging. It feels as though the few favourable court rulings are the only bulwark preserving democracy. The hope is that our nation can withstand this period, overcome what many perceive as tyranny, and swiftly replace those in power—particularly within the Supreme Court and the Executive Branch—to begin repairing the damage.

My first official ride of the season occurred on May 18. It was ride organized by our Secretary, Earl. We met at my place and had a nice ride over to Atlantic City and the Byrdcage, we enjoyed some refreshments and light fare. This was opportunity for one of our e-board members and full members Earl to assess the location for possible bar night who are other events to look at this location if you have not been here it is a brand new LGBT venue the first to open since all of the bars and clubs had closed in Atlantic City about 20 years ago it's nice to have a fresh place to go the people are friendly the management is even more friendlier and they will bend over backwards to accommodate us for future events – stay tuned.

The first event to happened for me was Saturday May 31st, 2025, this was my first pride event in South Jersey. On a personal note in between events my family celebrated moms 91st birthday, and mom and dad's 70th wedding anniversary, they married in 1955!

June 19 saw Lewis and Tim arrive from Pittsburgh to Somers Point NJ, they arrived in perfect time, racing ahead of the bad weather that eventually hit us here while we were enjoying a true seafood meal on the bay at Smitty's Clam Bar. As the storm was passing, I noticed that we might be able to see a nice sunset over the bay. I drove my cage to the southern tip of Somers Point, with a view of "Drag Island" (there is also "Rainbow Island" on the eastern side of Somers Point, and no I didn't make these names up!). As we viewed the sunset and got great photos, I noticed a small rainbow appearing, the next thing that appeared in the sky was a full rainbow right before our eyes. It was amazing!

June 20 Lewis and Tim and I headed to the Big Apple for the 61st Annual Motorcycle bike blessing. We made great timing up the Garden State Parkway to the NJ Turnpike to the Holland Tunnel (2 hours, 8 minutes!) Side note: the HOV lanes on the I-95/NJT are in the truck lanes! Scot secured some motorcycle parking for the event in front of Ty's early in the morning. What a nice evening of camaraderie, although a bittersweet moment, as Ty's was still mourning the loss of their manager George, just one week prior. George was remembered with a moment of silence by all attendees. ECMC members wore black ribbons to express condolences in the loss. During the event I got to hang out with Ruby from the Sirens MC. She is a sweet person if you get a chance to meet her. We blessed her yellow BMW. We also agreed to meet at a billiard hall or location with food and a few tables to have an ECMC vs Sirens Pool Tournament – stay tuned for more information! After the blessing, I returned to Somers Point doing the same route and again, 2 hours and 8 minutes!

On June 21 I needed to be home and prepping for the 61st Annual Motorcycle Picnic. The NYC contingent arrived at approximately 12:45 and ready to party! The temperature was about 83 degrees with low humidity. I had a lot of fun making sure that 100% of the attendees would be able to eat outside in the



shade, there was volleyball, firepit, bicycles available for riding, and more! The menu was hot dogs/cheeseburgers/pork sausage, mom's baked bean recipe, potato salad, and coleslaw and I topped it out with a homemade blueberry pie. I think almost all the food was eaten, and hardly any leftovers. I do enjoy hosting this event and hope I can in the future.

June 29th, it was back to NYC for the 55th Annual Pride March. I again did the same route to NYC; except this time, I went through the Lincoln Tunnel. I was running a few minutes late and arrived at the entrance point at 9:58am just in time as access was closed at 10:00am. Whew - that was too close. It is always fun decorating our bikes, hanging out with each other and connecting with a few peeps that we sometimes only see at the parade. We had a well-organized group of volunteer marshals, all in pink ECMC shirts that they had made themselves! It was nice to see so many friendly faces in pink with and our t-shirt design



supporting and promoting us! I personally think it was a cool design and reminded me of Speed Racer for some reason. Great event, no issues and I arrived home by 16:00.

July 9th, Wolf Pup and Wiley stopped over and we went over for a photo-op at "Lucy the Elephant" and had a nice meal with a view of Lucy. The boys departed trying to race home before the next storm hit.

Upcoming Events: On July 12, a double header! The first event is the Emilio Caranza wreath laying event in the middle of the Pine Barrens.
