Minutes of the 103rd AMCC Meeting

- I. CALL TO ORDER: The 103rd meeting of the Atlantic Motorcycle Coordinating Council was called to order at 12:07 P.M. by President Jose Reyes, at Valinor Farms, Kintnersville PA on May 9, 1992.
- IIA. PRESENT: Bucks MC, Centaur MC, Crucible MC, Cycle MC, Empire City MC, Excelsior MC, Griffins MC, Hartford Colts MC, Lost Angels, Pennsmen Inc, Philadelphians MC, Pittsburgh MC, Reading Railmen, Shipmates Club, Spartan MC, Thunderbolts MC, Vanguards MC, Vikings MC and Wheels MC.
 - IIB. PROXY: Iron Guard and SNC London.
- IIC. ABSENT: Entre Nous, MC Faucon, Highwaymen TNT, Nine Plus, Pocono Warriors and Scorpions MC.
- III. GUESTS: Dave G. (Excelsior MC), James L. (Exiles MC), Dan D. (Centaur MC) and Ron G. (GDI, Philadelphia).
- IV. Approval of Minutes; The minutes of the 102nd meeting were accepted as mailed (motion by Spartan MC, seconded by Griffin MC).

V. OFFICER REPORTS:

- A. President: Thank you to C.O.M.M.A.N.D. MC, Griffins MC and Shipmates Club for the arrangements made for the 102nd meeting. Remainder to New Business.
- B. VICE-PRESIDENT: Deferred to New Business.
- C. SECRETARY: Reviewed mail received from Loge 70, ASMF Paris, MSC Finland, SLM Stockholm, NLA, Philadelphians MC, Teddy Bear Leather Club, Leather Pride Night Committee, ORGASM, Pittsburgh MC, Crucible MC, Leitrim Flag Company and Lambda Rising. Also, requested member clubs to update roster listings and mailing addresses.
- D. TREASURER: Report attached to these minutes. Thanks to all who assisted at the successful AMCC bar night. Faul R., **Spartan MC**, has paid the Corporation fee for this year, thanks. Patch inventory is running low, will research prices and report at 104th meeting.
- E. COMMITTEE REPORTS: A two part report on AMCC participation in the NYC Pride March. The Chair reported that 30 slots have been guaranteed for bikers. Anyone interested should contact him.

There will be a fee of \$24.00 per rider. Also, marshals are needed to escort the bike contingent (10 -15). He will arrange housing for the bikers. Lee H., Thunderbolts MC, reported that a flyer will be sent with information for those wishing to march. Marchers are requested to pay a \$3.00 donation. Excelsior MC stated they will have a car for those who may need it. There will be a meeting of the NY member clubs on May 19th to discuss an AMCC float. A rosebush was also mentioned. Excelsior MC also stated that they will coordinate housing but are making no promises.

VI. OLD BUSINESS:

- A. Sanctioned Calendar:
 - 1. Pittsburgh MC notes they will not be using their sanction date, for 1993 only, in recognition of the importance of the March on Washington.
 - 2. Reading Railmen note that they will be celebrating their 14th Anniversary.
- B. Status of Member Clubs: Nine Plus submitted a letter placing themselves on inactive status at this time. This status will be for 11 months, at which time, unless AMCC is notified, Nine Plus will be automatically removed from membership.
- C. Discussions Between AMCC and MAC: The Chair attended the MAC meeting held during the Conductors L/L TRACK X, in Nashville TN. Currently MAC has 18 member clubs. MAC will make space available in it's quarterly newspaper for an AMCC column. Gordon G. (Hartford Colts MC) was the author of the first column. A brief history of the AMCC will be submitted for the second column. Plans were made for exchanging rosters and calendars. Contact will continue.
- D. IML Suite Reception: The Chair advised that Bob K. (Entre Nous) was doing the scheduling for the reception. An open bar is planned.

Philadelphians MC moved that "any remaining money donated to the AMCC IML Cocktail party exceeding \$100.00 be donated to AMFAR, remaining funds of less than \$100.00 should revert to the AMCC treasury". The motion was seconded by Vanguards MC. After a short but spirited discussion, the motion was defeated.

The Treasurer outlined the anticipated costs of the cocktail party and advised that the list of contributors (thus far) was on the reverse of his report.

After reviewing the list of contributors, Excelsion MC noted that it was much shorter than expected after all the enthusiasm in Baltimore. Excelsion advised perhaps it was "put up or shut up time".

VII. NEW BUSINESS:

- A. Location of the 105th meeting: The Vice-President advised, as only one request had been received, the 105th meeting of AMCC will be hosted jointly by **Cycle MC** and **Iron Guard** on December 12, 1992 in New York City.
- B. A motion was made by Excelsior MC to discuss the issue of money and the AMCC cocktail party. Motion was seconded by Vanguards MC and passed.

Excelsior stated it was their understanding that the \$250.00 voted from the treasury would be spent first, then the contributions, with any leftover funds being returned to the contributors.

Griffins MC requested basic clarification of who's invited, and how are they being invited in light of the original motion. The Chair responded that MAC was invited specifically and other "conferences" as we go.

The Treasurer noted it was not likely that there would be any funds leftover.

Thunderbolts MC moved that further discussion be tabled to the 104th meeting. Lost Angels seconded the motion and it passed.

C. Wheels MC raised the issue of the release of the Roster to businesses in particular and others in general.
