ATLANTIC MIDWEST COORDINATING COUNCIL

The 39th meeting of the AMCC scheduled for 2 p, m., July 24, 1976, at the Nine Plus Meeting House in New York City was called to order by the President at 2:52 p. m.

The following clubs were represented: Centaurs (Rusty O., Ed.S.), Cycle (Fernando A.), Druids (Ed N.), Empire City (Emil S.), L.I. Spuds (Mike J.), Levi Club (Jim G., Joe J.), Praetorians (John O.), SMCLA (J.D.), Thunderbolts (Alan M.), Vanguards (by written proxy), Wheels (John C., Mike C.), Shipmates (Dayton L.), Iron Guard (Artie F.). The Bucks, Kemo, Scorpions, SNMC, and Spartans were not represented.

The minutes of previous meeting held at Fire Island on May 15 were read by the Secretary and accepted without change.

The President, commenting on the minutes of the previous meeting, reminded the council that votes still had to be received from the three clubs which were not present at last meeting when a vote was taken on the motions to recognize Roberts' Rules of Order as the final decision maker at AMCC meetings and to create the position of Parliamentarian to interpret them. At this point, the representatives from the Thunderbolts and Wheels both cast "no" votes on the motions, making the final tally 2-yes, 13-no, with 1 abstention. Since no word has been received from Kemo; the President announced that the motions had been defeated.

The Treasurer gave a report as follows: previous balance \$182.65. Since last meeting the treasurer has received a check for \$30.00 from the Iron Guards for 40 patches giving a new balance as of July 24, 1976, of \$212.65.

J.D., chairman of AMCC '76, gave a report on the upcoming run in Atlantic City. J.D. 's report covered the following:

• Although only 110 applications have been received thus far, the run plans are pro-

gressing satisfactorily and will definitely be held as scheduled.

• J.D. reminded clubs that the committee stills needs club histories, slides, photographs, etc., for the publicity pamphlets and slide show. Two banners from each club, which will be returned after the run, are also needed.

The free drawing for a ticket to the bicentennial run will be held in Washington, D.C., on August 14th. J.D. urged the New York clubs to host a club night in New York City to promote the sale of raffle tickets so a joint drawing could be held. Jim G., a member of the council in New York, agreed to check this out and report back to J.D. In response to a question, Tim T. stated that tips received on such a club night would be put into the regular committee fund. J.D. reminded members that raffle tickets were due to be turned in by August 7.

• Report from Danny M. of the Shipmates and chairman of the special events subcommittee was presented to council. J.D. had limited copies of this report but stated

that all clubs would be furnished a copy.

• J.D. announced that the next meeting of the AMCC '76 committee would be in Atlantic City on August 7 at 4 o'clock at the Grand Hotel. The Grand Hotel is next to the Chester Inn where rooms are available for \$14.00 per night. Anyone planning to attend this meeting is requested to contact Danny for reservations.

OLD BUSINESS

The President asked for a vote on the admission into the AMCC of the Links M.C. of Washington, D.C. Tim reminded the council that a 3/4 affirmative vote of the entire membership was required for admittance. Tim stated that the Links was a very active club, had had two major functions, and a very successful run. Jim G. (Levi Club) stated that he had met several of their members and they have expressed a desire to work with the bicentennial committee, and have been willing to work with the committee although they are not presently members of the council. Ed S. (Centaurs) stated that the Links have always been willing to help other clubs in every way possible. Artie (Iron Guards) expressed his support for the Links becoming members of the council and expressed the opinion that acceptance of the Links would make the council even stronger. A vote on the motion to accept the Links into the council was taken by secret written ballot and approved by a vote of 14-yes, 0-no, with no abstentions.

NEW BUSINESS

There being no new business brought up before the council, the President asked if any representative had any announcements to make.

Ed S. (Centaurs) announced that the Centaurs were having a mini-run in Lorton, Virginia (just outside Washington, D.C.) from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. on August 21, with a rain date of August 22. Cost of this event will be \$10 per person (\$8 if you arrive by motorcycle). Applications were made available by Rusty and Ed of the Centaurs.

The President announced that the next meeting of the AMCC would be held during the Bicentennial Run in Atlantic City.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 4:20 p.m. without dissent.
