

AMCC

The 47th meeting of the AMCC was held on September 18, 1977, at Howard Johnson's Motel in the Delaware Water Gap in conjunction with Septemberfest.

The meeting was called to order by Walter K., president, at 3:00 p. m.

The following clubs were represented: Bucks, Centaurs, Empire City, Iron Guard, Links, L. I. Spuds, Lost Angels, N. Y. Levi, Praetorians, Scorpions, Spartans, Vanguard's, Wheels, and ShipMates.

The following clubs were not represented: Kemo, SNC (proxy), Thunderbolts.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved with one correction: "orange juice" was changed to read "Florida citrus juices."

Since the treasurer was not present, no report was given.

Because most clubs had not discussed the proposed revisions of the Articles, no formal action was taken by the Council. The following points were discussed:

- .The proposals are ambiguous about dismissal of a club.
- .The requirement that three copies of minutes, agenda, etc., be sent to each club would be expensive and time consuming.
- .Are there real advantages to having associate membership?
- .The wording of IX, A, 1 is ambiguous
- . What is meant by "censure"?
- .Should the Council sanction events?
- .The Council should be careful to coordinate, not dictate.
- .If two events are sanctioned on the same date, antagonism may be created.
