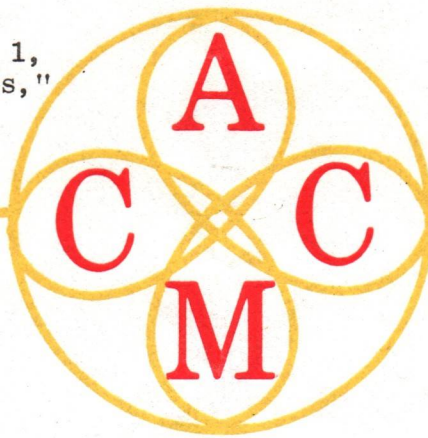


NEXT MEETING: Saturday, Nov. 1,  
at Lost Angels' "Autumn Scrambles,"  
Washington, D.C.



1980,

The 69th meeting of the AMCC convened at 11:10 a.m. on Saturday, August 23, in conjunction with M.C. Faucon's "Migration '80" (3rd anniversary run) at St. Alphonse, Québec, with Council President Don Craver (ShipMates) presiding. All AMCC officers were present. All Council members, with the exception of the Pennsmen, were represented in person or by proxy (SNC-London, Links, Poconos Warriors, Iron Guard). Guests included Reiner Giese (MSC-Berlin) and George McGarry of ASMC (Boston).

#### OLD BUSINESS:

Secretary Roger Pegram (Vanguards) read the minutes of the last meeting (May 17, 1980, New York City), which stood approved as distributed and read.

Treasurer Paul Rose (Spartans) gave the Treasurer's Report, showing a balance of \$552.28 in cash and an inventory of \$300.00 (sales price) in Council patches. He also noted that all Council clubs have now paid their 1980 assessment, and read the letter of greetings received from Richard Focke (SNC of London) which accompanied the club's cheque of \$25 (assessment), for which the Treasurer has officially thanked SNC (7/18/80).

The President noted the formation of three new clubs: the Rochester (NY) Fybreeds, the Buccaneers (Gautier, Miss.) and The 15 (San Francisco). No further changes were noted by Council members for the remainder of this year.

2. "The Rose Letter"

The President then asked Treasurer Rose to read and discuss the letter sent to all Council clubs under date of July 18, 1980. To avoid long preliminary discussion, a copy of Paul's letter is made an official part of these minutes.

The gist of this letter is that there exist some questions concerning sanctioned events: e.g., what, exactly, constitutes a sanctioned date? Frequency? Location? Conflicts with intracouncil affairs (bar nights, invitational anniversaries, etc.)? And the indication that potential for hard feelings, conflicts, and the like does exist; and that a Committee be established to discuss what, if anything, should be done, and if so, exactly what?

The letter evoked considerable discussion. After numerous comments and suggestions by John Casazza (Wheels M.C.), Dave Sherman (Entre Nous), Jim Gress (NY Levis) and others, Hugh Gage (Centaur's) motioned that: (1) sanctioned dates and approval of

such dates be investigated, with the idea of establishing a system of approved (vis-à-vis sanctioned) dates; and (2) to examine, in general manner, the Articles of Agreement, "tidying-up" the language of the Articles. Seconded by Bucks/Scorprions. John Casazza moved to amend the motion that the Committee establish sub-committees, following a regional pattern (e.g., New York City, Baltimore/D.C.). Seconded by Praetorians. The amendment failed (7 for, 9 against, and an undetermined number of apparent abstentions).

In light of this failure, the President agreed to name the Committee (passed, 18-3), and named two within his discretion: Treasurer Rose and Secretary Pegram. He then asked for volunteers, and appointed three: Jim Gress, Pierre Phénix and Bob LaPointe. Treasurer Rose withdrew, being the sponsor of the Committee through his letter, and the President appointed Hugh Gage as the replacement. The Secretary also asked to be relieved, being an officer of the Council, but the President declined this offer of resignation due to the advisability of there being a central repository for minutes and proceedings which logically lies with the Council Secretary. The Committee is thus:

Centaur (Chair) (Va./D.C.)  
Entre Nous (Boston/New England)  
M.C. Faucon (Canada)  
New York Levis (New York City area)  
Vanguards (Pennsylvania)

Thus, the Committee does reflect a regional composition, as proposed by John Casazza.

3. The President reiterated the method of selecting the recipient of the Torrid Tuba award, reminded clubs of the need for 1981 sanctioned dates (due next meeting) and nominations for the 1981-83 AMCC officers, and asked that at least one "working meeting" of the new Committee be held prior to the next full Council meeting. (It can be done prior to "Autumn Scrambles" at that event.) Note Pennsylvania clubs: Roger Pegram has asked for input to a Pa. meeting to be held at "Septemberfest '80." Any other Committee members present are urged to attend this preliminary meeting.


4. Two further Council meetings will be held by year-end 1980: the Council voted for one at the Lost Angels "Autumn Scrambles," and another at the Spuds' "Horsin' Around" run, December 6. (Moved by Wheels M.C./Druids.)
