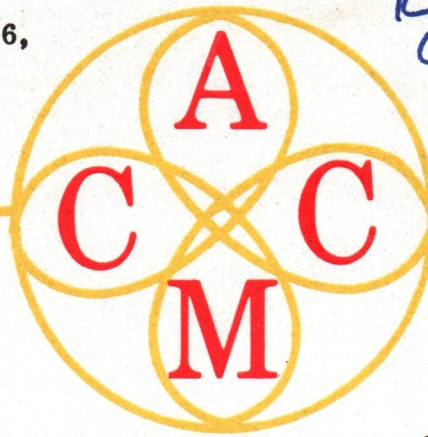


**NEXT MEETING: Saturday, Dec. 6,

The 61st meeting of the AMCC convened at 1:05 p.m. on Saturday, November 1, 1980, in conjunction with the Lost Angels' "Autumn Scrambles/Wer Ist Erda?" run in Washington, D.C., with Council President Don Craver (ShipMates) presiding. All AMCC officers were present. All Council members, with the exception of the Pennsmen and the Praetorians, were represented in person or by proxy (SNC-London, T-Bolts, Vikings). Guests included Mike Bridger (MC Faucon), Ken Clark + 1 (DC Vulcans), and Charlie Gamble (GDI - guest of Druids). John Lee (Bucks) and John Olireo (Spuds) were also present as guests.

#### OLD BUSINESS:

Secretary Roger Pegram (Vanguards) read the minutes of the last meeting (August 23, St. Alphonse, Québec), which stood approved as distributed and read. The Secretary stated his belief that <sup>reading</sup> the minutes of each preceding meeting is beneficial due to the lengthy periods elapsing between Council meetings.

Treasurer Paul Rose (Spartans) gave the Treasurer's report, showing a cash balance of \$619.59 and a patch inventory of \$240.- (sales price). A copy of Paul's report is incorporated in the official copy of these minutes.

The President noted the receipt of a letter of thanks from Reiner Glese of MSC-Berlin, who attended the Council meeting at the MC Faucon run.

- Druids 11th anniversary, Saturday, October 31 (Washington)

Rod Stine (Scorpions) noted that his club would not be holding an '81 run. The only conflict is between the LAs and Druids. They are to try to resolve this between them. The President commended unto all the holding of runs and smaller anniversary celebrations in alternating years.

**ATLANTIC MOTORCYCLE COORDINATING COUNCIL**



President Craver called on Hugh Gage (Centaur), Chairman of the By-Laws Committee, for an interim/progress report. The Committee feels that the sanctioned dates portion of the Articles of Agreement be left as now formulated, but with some clarification of the current language. Conflicts among nonofficially-sanctioned events should be worked out among affected clubs on a regional basis. The Council is to keep out of "nonevents," such as bar nights. The Chairman also suggested that the Committee look into the April start date for officers in light of the few events held during the first quarter of the calendar year. The Chairman further suggests that the Articles be broadened to include provision for reprimands, allowing for eventual expulsion for repeated violations of the Articles by a Council member club. Hugh also asks that clubs review Articles and communicate desired or feasible changes to him before the next Council meeting, also strongly advocated by Committee Member Jim Gress (NY Levis). Joe Marengo (Bucks) reiterated the need for "cleaning up" the sanctioned dates language. Finally, Hugh reported Bill Toye's (Pocono Warriors) suggestion of the Vice President of the Council disseminating dates of events by noncouncil organizations.

#### NEW BUSINESS:

1. The President announced that nominations for 1981-83 Council officers will take place at the December meeting. Traditionally, ballots are counted at a March meeting. The President also announced, to the regret of the Council at large, that he will not be available for any Council office for the next term.
2. The next Council meeting, to take place at 11 a.m., Dec. 6, at the Spuds run, will also see voting for the famed Torrid Tuba award. Delegates are asked to consult their individual clubs; but realistically speaking, each delegate should probably have the authority to recommend his club's vote since he has more than likely attended more runs and events than his club brothers, and is thus in a better position to judge.
3. The President suggested that the question of the next Council meeting (after Dec. 6) be entertained at this time due to its importance as the election meeting. Entre Nous and NY Levis both extended invitations; motioned (Spartans/Bucks) and passed to hold this next meeting in conjunction with the Levis' anniversary on March 28 in New York City.

#### GOOD AND WELFARE:

Delegate Hugh Gage protested official Council club involvement in noncouncil events when in conflict with sanctioned dates, specifically Wheels M.C. hosting an affair at Cycle M.C.'s August "Red, Hot and Cycle!" run in New York City. Wheels delegate Al Cataldo declined response at this time, and the Centaur's delegate declined further comment.

Paul Rose announced that "Brother, Help Thyself!" had netted \$10M+, and specifically thanked the Vanguard's for its "contest" at "Septemberfest," which contributed nearly \$600. The President, on behalf of the Council, congratulated Co-Chairmen Rose and Robb Chelchowski (ShipMates) on the overwhelming success of the event.

Reminders/nonsanctioned events: (1) Rod Stine announced that the Scorpions anniversary beer-blast would be held from 6 to 9 on Nov. 7 at the Exile; (2) Bill Marley announced that the Warriors next social is on Nov. 22 in NYC (Nov. 12 is the cut-off); (3) The Bucks annual Santa Saturday is Saturday, Nov. 29; (4) Robb Chelchowski noted the International Dinner (charity) will be on Sunday, Dec. 14; (5) Ray Hard (Links) announced that the famed Leather Cocktails will be on Saturday, Jan. 17, 1980, at the Hippo in Baltimore; (6) Dave Cundiff is the new President of the Druids.

President Craver thanked the LAs for the exceptionally nice brunch, and the meeting stood adjourned at 1:40 (Centaur's/Excelsior).


