NEXT MEETING Saturday, April 9, 1983 Spartan 15th Anniversary Washington, DC

The 70th Meeting of the AMCC was called to order by President Keith Battin on Saturday, November 6, 1982, at Noon at Mr. P's Bar in Washington, DC during the Lost Angels "Autumn Scrambles" Run. The Vice-President was absent having had a heart attack on the previous Thursday and was in the hospital in Philadelphia. The following clubs were present in person: Bucks, Centaur, Companions, Empire City, Excelsior, Faucon, Iron Guard, Lost Angels, Pennsmen, Philadelphians. Scorpions. ShipMates, Spartan, Spuds, Thunderbolts. Vikings, Warriers, Wheels. The following clubs were present by proxy: Praetorians, Railmen, SNC, Vanguards. Entre Nous was absent. Guests were introduced. They were: George Delaney and Legion Griffith of the Crucibles of Pittsburgh; John Zaproski of the Rochester Rams; Jack Maurissi and Marc Parker of the Wildcats of Norfolk, VA. It was announced that Jerry Reber, President of the Railmen and candidate for Treasurer of the AMCC was in the hospital in Reading.

The minutes of the 69th Meeting were read by the Secretary and stood approved as read and submitted. The Treasurer gave his report in writing which showed a cash balance of \$656.00 and a patch inventory of 13. A copy of his report is attached to the official copy of these minutes. New patches are on order and should be ready in December.

The President read a letter from the Crucibles stating that they would seek membership in the AMCC once they met the one year of Lormal existance requirement. The President announced that he had heard from the Steel Barons of Pittsburgh which had received a copy of the Articles of Agreement.

## OLD BUSINESS

The President asked for any changes in the sanction calendar for 1983 as listed in the minutes of the 69th Meeting. Changes were made as Mollows: The Warriors. Scorpions, Vikings, and Railmen said that the dates as noted were the ones they would respectively use for their sanctioned events. Iron Guard released July 16. The Faucon released August 26-28 and requested August 20. The Bucks released July 4 and requested November 26. The ShipMates released June 24-26 and requested July 1-4. The Vanguards released October 9 and requested October 16. With these changes included, it was moved by the ShipMates and seconded by Faucon to approved the 1983 Sanction Calendar as requested at the 69th Meeting and amended at the 70th Meeting. The motion passed without dissent.

Wheels MC noted that TREAD would print these dates as well as any submitted articles from the AMCC member clubs. It was noted that it was hoped that clubs would advertise their runs and events in TREAD which would serve to hold the cost of printing the magazine down. Circulation was increasing due to the demands being placed on TREAD to carry the AMCC news and the news of clubs outside the AMCC.

## NEW BUSINESS

Paul Rose announced on behalf of the organizers of Leather Cocktails that there would not be a Leather Cocktails party hosted by them in 1983.

The President called for the election of the 1983-85 officers of the AMCC. He appointed George Delaney and John Zaproski as tellers. The Secretary gave the tellers the sealed envelopes containing the ballots as submitted by the clubs. The ballots were opened and counted with the following results:

PRESIDENT -- Paul Rose (Spartan)

<u>V1CE-PRESIDENT</u> -- Kevin Coughlin (Excelsior)

SECRETARY -- Mike Bridger (Faucon)

TREASURER -- Jerry Reber (Railmen)

The officers elect were given a round of applause. They will assume their duties, as the Articles direct, on April 5, 1983.

Paul Rose read a letter sent to him by the President of the European Conference of Motorcycle Clubs (ECMC) which suggested a joint European-American run in the future. He asked for the opinion of the AMCC. The general opinion expressed was that this was an interesting suggestion that the AMCC should officially explore without committing itself to holding the event until the exploration of its feasability was finished. Then a determination would be made as to holding the suggested event.

MOTION (Scorpiens/Thunderbolts) To appoint a steering committee to look into the feasability of a joint European-American run. PASSED

The President announced that he would appoint this committee in consultation with the President-elect.

The ShipMates asked how the Council determined the status of member clubs which had announced their dissolution. Were they members even after they dissolved or ceased to function since they had not resigned from the AMCC or what?

MOTION (ShipMates/Vikings) To appoint a committee to investigate the status of self-announced disolved member clubs to determine their membership and to recommend any changes that might be needed in the Articles of Agreement. PASSED

The President appointed the ShipMates, Spartan, and Empire City to this committee.

The President called for nomination for the Torrid Tuber, that most coveted award that can be given to any member club of the AMCC. The following clubs were nominated:

Lost Angels for the 1982 Autumn Scrambles run flier Bucks because they wanted it so badly Thunderbolts for their room arrangements at their 11th anniversary Faucon for always running their run and its events on time Vikings because they should keep it

Entre Nous because it should be kept in Boston Ballots were quickly cast and the Bucks became the proud new holders of the Torrid Tuber.

The President asked the Council to set the date for the next Council meeting. The following clubs offered to host a meeting: Spartan on April 9; Excelsior on May 14; Wheels on May 28; Scorpions on June 11. By a vote, the Council decided to meet next on April 9 during the Spartan's 15th Anniversary in Washington, DC.
