

1. GENERAL AND ADMINISTRATIVE

A. Introduction

The 76th Meeting of the AMCC was called to order by President Paul Rose at 11:30 AM on Saturday, July 7, 1984 at Hauska House, Saylorsburg, PA, during the weekend of The Bucks 'Pow-Wow 84.'

B. Roll-Call

All member clubs were represented in person, with the exception of Centaurs, Crucible, Steel Barons and SNC London who were present by proxy and Vikings who were absent.

C. Guests

Roy Bowman (Cycle MC), Art Lemoyne (Nine Plus) and Jacques Oliveau (Stud MC) were welcomed as guests.

D. Minutes of the 75th Meeting

On the motion of Spartans/Thunderbolts, the Minutes of the 75th Meeting were accepted as submitted.

E. Officer's Reports

President-Letters had been received from Excelsior confirming cancellation of their run; from Wheels announcing Angel Burges as their new President and AMCC rep and from Crucible expressing thanks for the support of the Council. The President also noted that since the next AMCC executive must be elected prior to 5 April 1985, it was time for the Council to consider when and where the nomination and voting meetings would be held.
Vice-President-No report
