

NEXT MEETING
Saturday, May 18, 1985
Noon at The Spike
Excelsior's 10th Anniversary

The 78th meeting of the AMCC was called to order by President Paul Rose at 12:30pm on Saturday, February 16, 1985, at The Archives Restaurant in Harrisburg, Penna., during the Pennsmen's 8th Anniversary Keystone Capital Run. The Treasurer and the Vice-President were both present. The following clubs were present in person: Bucks, Crucible, Empire City, Entre Nous, Excelsior, MC Faucon, Iron Guard, Long Island Spuds, Lost Angels, Pennsmen, Pocono Warriors, Praetorians, Reading Railmen, Scorpions, ShipMates, Spartan, Steel Barons, Thunderbolts, Vanguards, Wheels, Wildcats. The following clubs were present by proxy: Centaur, Companions, SNC London, Vikings. The following club was absent: Philadelphians. The following guests were introduced: Peter Rapp, President of the Pittsburgh MC; John Ryzinski, President of the Nine Plus Club of New York City.

On motion of Entre Nous and seconded by the Bucks, the minutes of the 77th meeting were approved as submitted and the reading of the minutes was waived.

OFFICERS' REPORTS

President - The President announced that he had received inquiries about membership in the AMCC from the Nine Plus Club and from the Highwaymen TNT of Washington, DC. He announced that the AMCC had been notified of the new officers of MC Faucon, Wildcats, and Empire City. He also had received letters of intention to nominate for membership in the AMCC the Nine Plus Club from Iron Guard and the Long Island Spuds. He had received offers to host the 79th Meeting from the Thunderbolts and Excelsior and had received an offer to host the 80th Meeting from the Centaur MC. He noted that new patches had been ordered & had been paid for and delivered to the Treasurer.

Vice-President - No report.

Treasurer - The Treasurer handed out a written report showing a balance of \$612.54 with a patch inventory of 368 as of February 15, 1985.

OLD BUSINESS

The President opened the floor for revisions to and additions to the 1985 proposed sanction calendar. The following changes were requested: Entre Nous dropped March 15 from their sanction request. Wheels changed their dates to May 10-12 and announced that W-16 would be held at a new site in Parksville, NY. Iron Guard withdrew their request for a sanction date of September 14 and announced their anniversary would be an invitational affair. The Spartan MC requested September 29 to sanction the club rotation day of Brother, Help Thyself in Washington, DC. The Wildcats requested sanction for October 11-13 for an in-town run in Norfolk, Va. to be called Harbor Lights.

MOTION (ShipMates/Faucon) To grant sanction to the requests made at the 77th Meeting and to incorporate and sanction the changes and requests made at the 78th Meeting. PASSED

At this point, the President appointed the Pittsburgh MC and the Nine Plus as tellers and asked Peter Rapp and John Ryzinski to take the ballots for the 1985-87 AMCC officers and to open and tabulate the results.

The President called for a vote on the membership of the Pittsburgh MC in the AMCC.

MOTION (Iron Guard/Spuds) To delay the vote on the Pittsburgh MC until the 79th Meeting. FAILED

It was explained that some clubs did not know the Pittsburgh MC and wished additional time to make up their minds.

Ballots were distributed and were collected by the Vanguards and the Wildcats who acted as tellers. The Pittsburgh MC was elected to membership in the AMCC by the required 80% vote.

The Spartan MC presented their addition to the Torrid Tuber. Instead of merely adding a patch to the "rube goldberg" collation, the Spartans presented the Council with a lucite case with wood base which held a mechanical doll, dressed as a belly dancer, holding the Spartan MC colors. When a button is pressed on the base that the doll is standing upon, the doll gyrates in a belly dance motion. Empire City, current proud holders of the Torrid Tuber, graciously accepted this addition on behalf of the AMCC and said they would take good care of it until it was time to select a new proud recipient.

The Iron Guard and the Long Island Spuds placed the Nine Plus Club of New York City in nomination for membership in the AMCC. The President read a letter from the Nine Plus requesting membership and stating that they met the requirements. A vote on the membership of Nine Plus will be taken at the 79th Meeting.

Steve Faulk a former member of the Vanguards.


George Delaney, President and founder, of the Crucible MC of Pittsburgh.


