SUBJECT: 95th A.M.C.C. Meeting Minutes
Saturday, December 30, 1989
Poughkeepsie, NY (Iron Guard/Moor Cocks)

- I. CALL TO ORDER: The meeting was called to order by President Joe Marengo at 5:07 pm.
- IIA. PRESENT: Bucks MC; Cycle MC; Empire City MC; Excelsior MC; Griffins MC; Hartford Colts MC; Iron Guard; Long Island Spuds; Philadelphians; Reading Railmen; ShipMates; Spartan MC; Thunderbolts MC; Vanguard MC; Vikings MC; Wheels MC.
- IIB. PROXY: Centaur MC; Companions; Crucible MC; Entre Nous; MC Faucon; Highwaymen TNT; Pittsburgh MC; SNC London; Scorpions MC.
- IIC. ABSENT: Lost Angels; Nine Plus; Pennsmen; Pocono Warriors.
- III. GUESTS: Moor Cocks (Poughkeepsie); C.O.M.M.A.N.D. (Baltimore); Rangers (Cleveland); Unicorn (Cleveland); Exiles (Buffalo); and Mike and Jerry from Vermont, friends of many.
- IV. APPROVAL OF MINUTES: A letter from Joe Laing (Vikings) was attached to the agenda indicating corrections to the minutes. Corrected minutes will be included in the package with minutes for the 95th meeting. Also omitted were items relating to SNC London and a motion by the Griffins. Minutes as amended and corrected (to be mailed) accepted.
- V. OFFICERS' REPORTS:
 - A. Treasurer: Gave financial report of A.M.C.C.; as of December 30, Long Island Spuds, Nine Plus and SNC London have not paid the \$25.00 assessment. Report accepted.
 - B. Secretary: Letter from MC Faucon with their membership verification; reminded membership that membership verification requests would be going out and for their prompt return.
 - C. Vice President: No report at this time.

OLD BUSINESS:

A. Roster revisions: Asked for complete information about Clubs and their officers and correct mailing addresses.

B. Approval of 1990 Sanction Calendar: See "A.M.C.C. SANCTIONED CALENDAR 1990" enclosed. Changes: 1) Thunderbolts took back their dates of June 15 - 17 for anniversary; 2) Spartans withdrew their date of July 21; 3) Reading Railmen requested October 6 - 7.

C. Nominations and awarding of the Torrid Tuber for 1989: The floor was opened for nominations; Spartans nominated ShipMates "for hiring a drag queen to mc their anniversary show when they could have and should have done it themselves! Previous nominees were Thunderbolts (2 times); Bucks; Reading Railmen.

THE WINNER: THUNDERBOLTS OF CONNETICUT by a large majority - (20 votes for T-Bolts, 3 Bucks, 2 ShipMates).

D. Articles of Agreement: As revised (addition of Fair and Equitable Hosting of Meetings) to Articles had to be passed. Motion by ShipMates, seconded by Thunderbolts to revise the Articles of Agreement as mailed with the 94th Minutes; passed unanimously.

NEW BUSINESS:

A. Status of non-participating Clubs: Two (2) clubs were discussed, Nine Plus and SNC London. A letter will be sent again, to Nine Plus requesting a letter of intent of the Club to remain active within A.M.C.C. and also requesting their membership verification.

SNC London was again discussed; without following the Articles, no actions can be taken. On a motion by the Griffins and seconded by the ShipMates, a challenge to the standing proxy is issued. A letter will go out to the Club asking for a current proxy and club list with officers.

B. New business from the floor: ShipMates motioned that the minutes be again sent to the Club address as well as the Club rep. Seconded by Reading Railmen; passed with 2 abstentions.

C. Scheduling of 96th Council Meeting: Vice President Hard had two (2) requests- 1) from the Pennsmen for a meeting at their February anniversary; and 2) from the ShipMates during their anniversary in April. Since the Pennsmen did not have a representative at the meeting where the request was made, it could not be considered. Motion by Empire City for the 96th meeting to be held during the ShipMates anniversary of April 6 - 8; motioned accepted.

D. Club Announcements:

1. Thunderbolts (CT) invited everyone to their 19th Anniversary in Essex, CT on June 15 and 16.

2. Entre Nous flyers for Equinox in Orlando out shortly; P'Town mid-winter trip in February.
