RECENTLY we received for review a new book (March 1972) written by Peter Fisher. Although it is not the policy of this Club or publication to comment on the subject matter of the book in general -- we were extremely impressed by the chapters dealing with the leather scene. The editor of this magazine has never before read a more forthright and objective report on the leather scene. It is obvious that Peter Fisher is a man of keen intellect. Although he is new to the leather scene, his writing suggests that he did a lot of "homework" before he sat down to his typewriter. He first analyzed the scene and when he further reported on the subject, he respected his OWN analysis of the subject and afforded anonymity to persons and places. We strongly recommend the book, if only for pages 81 thru 94. This book should do more to foster understanding of our sub-culture than all its predecessors put together ! We don't know if it is an original statement, but the last sentence of the chapter referred to above ends with the question -- "Is being different the same as being sick". The book is "The Gay Mystique" by Peter Fisher, 258 pages, \$7.95 (hard cover) published by Stein and Day, 7 East 48th St., New York, NY 10017.



## LAKE RIDERS




