Dear Members of the Empire City Motorcycle Club:



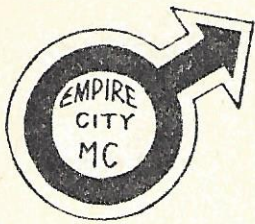
