Jeff I want to again send our heartfelt thank you to you and all the members of the club for your continued support to the children and families in our program .


It is always a treat to attend the Christmas Party where so much love is given through the gifts that we receive for the children. We are truly honored to be the special guests of such an event.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF SIRENS MC NYC AND THE NYC PRIDE PARADE

It was in the summer of 1986 that a small handful of women riders came to the Club meeting full of their news: they had just ridden their bikes in the 17th Annual NYC Pride March! The March had not seen motorcycles ridden in it since the 1970s when a small group of gay men rode. They had difficulty operating in between walking groups with no room to move causing bikes to over heat. After a couple of years they gave up.

As the following June rolled around, Club members contacted Heritage Of Pride and registered 20 women riders. We met with HOP's committee members and explained the difficulty of riding bikes in the midst of the March. We discussed our concerns: the possible dangers for the walking groups in front or behind us, the possibility of bikes overheating with no room to get them out of the way. We proposed our solutions including having marshals of our own and riding responsibly. We demonstrated that we were prepared to create as safe an environment as possible so that everyone could enjoy the bikes. The green light lit -- we were told to ride ahead of the March as a sort of advance group. And we formed the lasting bond of mutual respect with HOP.

That year the waiting crowds went wild with excitement when the motorcycles first appeared and when it became obvious that we were all women, they were even more enthusiastic with their cheering and shouts of support!

The year after that, HOP asked us to liase with other bikers who contacted them directly and to coordinate what would become the "motorcycle contingent." At first it was the guys from Empire City M.C. who wanted to ride too. It was agreed that the m/c formation would reflect that of the Pride March itself: women riders in front to combat lesbian invisibility and the men behind them in their own defined group. A strong bond was formed between the two clubs with lasting friendships being forged. As time went by we invited other clubs to join us and there were many GDI's (or lone wolves) that contacted us. We made outreach efforts and the size of the m/c contingent grew every year.

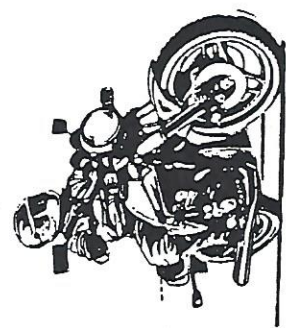
Then came the invitations: to lead the new Pride Marches being organized in the tri-state area. The crowds in Queens, Brooklyn, Asbury Park, and in Huntington were just as thrilled to see the motorcycles out in front. This year we hope to ride for Bronx Pride too.

Our greatest achievement was recorded last year when we actually had more than 100 motorcycles on Fifth Avenue on Pride Sunday. We haven't achieved the numbers recorded for San Francisco yet -- but we are working on it!
