Did not meet yet. Reinhold will get it together next week.

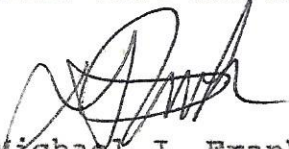
WESTSIDE DISCUSSION GROUP: Reinhold reports that the discussion on the Bike Scene went over well.
