## A NEW YEAR....

The Executive Board met in closed session on December 21st to appoint a new Assistant Road Captain to fill a vacancy created by Art H., who resigned from that office after only having served approximately 3 months of his term. (Atlantic Midwest Co-ordinating Council) will also be meeting in Boston to elect its officers for the coming year; the nominations to be made at the L.I. ### EQUINOX '75...

The Equinox Planning Committee is meeting periodically to finalize the weekend schedule of activities. Most activities will be centered around the historic Charles Street Meetinghouse. The traditional poker stops on Saturday afternoon run parallel with the Freedom Trail where club members and independents will be able to take in the sights of Boston. 1975 marks the beginning of America's bicentennial commemoration and Boston will lead the nation with appropriate observances.

The run will take place on March 21-23 and promises to be a blast. "Climb into something groovy" is the theme suggested on the poster. Poster credits for design go to Jack G. Chuck B. is putting a show together and as chairman, he will be soliciting your talented support. Buffets, drinks, discotheque, dinner and show, after hours parties and general mayhem, combined with about three hundred hot bods will make for a good time in old bean town.

Run fees are \$33.00 for EN; \$35.00 for other clubs; \$37.00 for non-club members. All fees include the \$1.00 per person assessment required by the A.M.C.C. for the bi-

centennial fund. An additional \$2.00 late fee will be charged for all applications received after March 15 1975.

Roy V. is in charge of housing and club members are requested to notify the planning committee if they have space available. Jim C. and Woody M. will once again combine their skills in handling the run budget and the registration, respectively. Dave B. will handle the crew for any equipment moves, banner locations, maintenance clean-up, etc. Paul C. is handling publicity and advertising, run books, programs, confirming letters, etc. Ed R. is chairman of the food committee and he promises a sumptuous cuisine.

The Planning Committee anticipates the excellent cooperation it had in P-town '74 to make Equinox '75 a huge success.

Equinox '75 is also the site of the A.M.C.C. annual election. The affiliated club delegation will be served brunch at the 9 Knox Street Restaurant where their meeting will be held to elect officers. Nominations will take place at the SPUDS run on Long Island this month; the results will be published in the next Nous Lettre.

Tickets are currently being printed for an Equinox Sweepstakes Raffle. Several cash prizes will be awarded on Sunday of the run during the trophies and awards presentation.

The Equinox Committee prepared its list of trophies to be presented during the Run. Among those include Best Support by a member, by an associate, by another club and by an independent. The traditional Brotherhood trophy will also be presented.

### DUES...

At its last regular meeting on January 12th, Entre Nous' Business Manager gave a financial statement. The club voted to retain the \$5.00 per month full membership dues until Dec. 31, 1976. Associate membership dues will also remain at \$12.00 per year.

## WHAT IS AMCC?

Not too many club members and independents know too much about the A.M.C.C. Don't feel badly, because it took me a while to figure out what the initials stood for. Nowhere does the spelled-out title appear even in its Articles of Agreement. I even thought of the A.M.C.C. to be another club when I first saw someone wearing a patch. I was gradually educated to learn that the council was a council of affiliated clubs....like Entre Nous. As far as I knew at the time, this group met from time to time at various runs to discuss matters pertinent to all affiliated clubs. Each club was represented by a delegate and each could cast only one vote. Then I came to know that the council serves to help straighten out a big mess from year to year.....namely the run business. Aha! After looking at our "Chain of Events" column for 1975, I can appreciate the problem that arises. And, I sympathize with the guys who have to get together and serve as a clearing house so that no one affiliated club can throw a major run which might otherwise conflict with another sanctioned club date. It's that simple and for the most part, it seems to be working.

However, not too many guys are familiar with the A.M.C.C. Some men refer to it as "heaven sent" because for the lack of it, all the clubs could choose run dates which might otherwise conflict, especially in nearby cities. And it would probably be tough to choose one of two

or three of your favorite runs without a system of scheduling.

Others, out of misinformation, could care less about the A.M.C.C. If a delegate isn't doing his job, then the rank and file attending club meetings would only hear, perhaps what is being fed to them, if anything. For the most part, the council remains the furthest thing from their minds. And, somehow, the club continues to have representation even without an endorsed vote from year to year by the membership. Some members would prefer not to be affiliated in order to hold a few extra major functions for all to attend.

WE ENDORSE THE A.M.C.C.....and not simply because they will be meeting here in Boston in March, nor that I would be chained to the rack for saying anything to the contrary.

The A.M.C.C. is a vital force and a useful tool for any club to use when properly applied. Of all groups within the gay community, we hold these truths to be self-evident: Leather/Levi Clubs are the most efficient and well-organized groups in the country. Carefully structured clubs with certain fraternal rules coupled with self-determination make us survive. The genius members who thought of providing a common base should be congratulated. We now have a council in the A.M.C.C. which can serve as a forum for all L/L guys to exchange ideas, experiences and good times within the club scene; arrange calander dates so that all might benefit and participate at several runs from city to city, and provide the opportunity to see how our brothers operate within clubs in regional areas of the country.

The A.M.C.C. is not out to act as super club; not out to interfere with the internal workings of any club nor upset club sovereignty.

It can offer guidelines for newly-organized clubs to follow. It can offer experience from those who have been into the scene longer and it can offer assistance when called upon. We are all brothers in this regard. The A.M.C.C. can protect its own just as we share the same brotherhood within our own club.

The A.M.C.C. is only as strong as its collective affiliates. In order

for us to become individually familiar with the council, it is necessary for the membership to listen and talk with the club's representative and to make sure he discusses matters with our best interests in mind. After all, each club has but one vote, and that vote should express the majority intent of our club.

By the way, A.M.C.C. stands for Atlantic Midwest Co-ordinating Council.

# galley slave....

Hats off to Roy V. who submitted this month's recipe to the GALLEY SLAVE.

## HARVEY G. WALLBANGER CAKE

You need:

- 1 pkg. 2-layer orange cake mix
- 1 pkg. 3 3/4 oz. instant vanilla pudding mix
- 4 eggs
- 1/2 cup cooking oil
- 1/2 cup Galliano
- 1 Harvey Wallbanger (6 oz. orange juice, 1/2 oz. Galliano and 1 oz. vodka)

Mix: together in a large bowl, the orange cake mix with the instant vanilla pudding mix. Blend in eggs, oil and 1/2 cup of Galliano along with a Harvey Wallbanger. Mix until smooth. Pour into greased (you know where you put that Crisco) and floured 10" fluted tube pan. Bake for 45 min. in a pre-heated 350° oven. When done, cool in pan for about 10 minutes, remove to rack (untie whoever is on there) and pour on glaze while still warm.

Glaze: Blend 1 cup of powdered sugar, 1 tablespoon vodka and 1 tablespoon of Galliano.

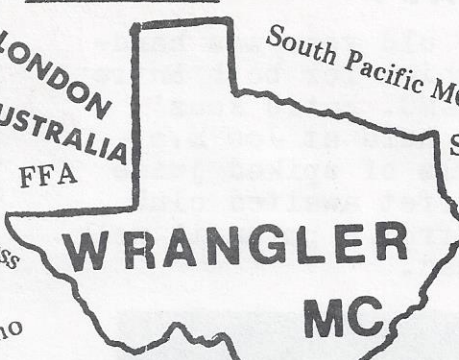

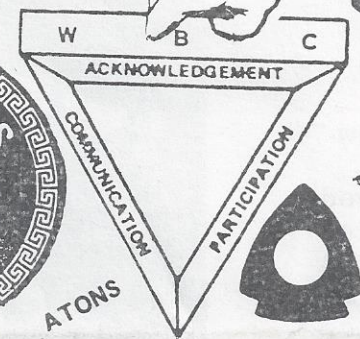

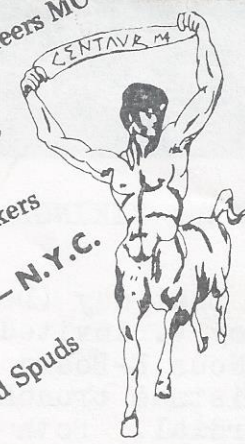
