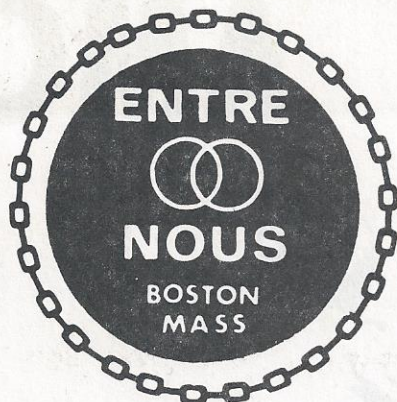

AMCC...AGAIN

ENTRE NOUS' decision to remain as a member-club of the Atlantic Midwest Coordinating Council (AMCC) or remove its membership status will be determined at a special meeting to be convened on May 9, 1976.

Continual developments in the AMCC controversy over the past two years were further added to when the Council took no action against those member-clubs in violation of the 1976 Guidelines which governed sanctioned runs. The AMCC met in March during the Boston Massacre Run to defeat a motion presented by the VIKINGS MC.

ENTRE NOUS' Executive Board took further action by bringing the issue directly to its membership at a meeting held on March 21st. The Board approved a motion to repeal Article VI of the By-laws, which if passed by 2/3 vote of those present and voting, including proxies, will remove the Club from the AMCC. The vote will take place at the special meeting on May 9th. A 30-day notice requirement had to precede the date of the special meeting.

It is ironic that the vote will take place during May since the Club joined the AMCC in May, 1971.

The issue is complex with facts well known to all, and will require some deep thought. The VIKINGS MC recently voted to withdraw from the Council but will continue supporting the AMCC '76 Bicentennial this fall.

Captain Joe K. expressed extreme outrage when the Council took

no action against those clubs in violation of the rules.

Reaction to ENTRE NOUS' thinking about quitting the AMCC was mixed. During the Boston Massacre, several members approached ENTRE NOUS officers requesting the Club not to withdraw. Some requests came from those members of clubs in violation of the Council's guidelines.

Both ENTRE NOUS and the VIKINGS MC championed the way in 1976 by hosting the Boston Massacre after an agreement had been reached last November at an AMCC meeting. Now it seems that many clubs are going back on their word by announcing plans for runs in 1976. "As far as I'm concerned, the era of compromise is over," announced Joe K. "We gave up P-town '75, Equinox '76 and the VIKINGS gave up Leif Erikson, plus we had resignations and internal strife within the Club. ENTRE NOUS cannot put up with anymore," said the Club's captain.

There are opponents to pulling out of the AMCC. Some suggest that this year is a mess because of the bicentennial affair, but it will straighten itself out in the years to come. The VIKINGS MC withdrew but they will still not have Leif Erikson. ENTRE NOUS could be caught in violation of the rules if it embarked on its plans for P-town '76.

What has plagued the AMCC over the last couple of years has been a combination of petty politics, lack of public relations and direction, geographical mini-pacts among clubs and various degrees of club sovereignty.

A vote to withdraw from the AMCC will affect its full and associate members across the country. ENTRE NOUS members will be asked to remove AMCC patches. However, those members belonging to another AMCC club will have the option to continue wearing the AMCC patch. Again, the vote takes place on MAY 9TH

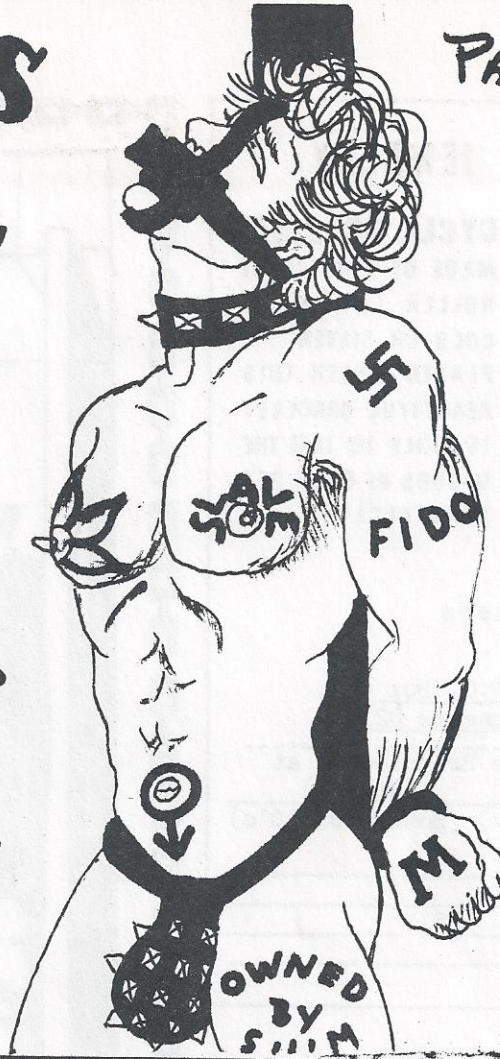

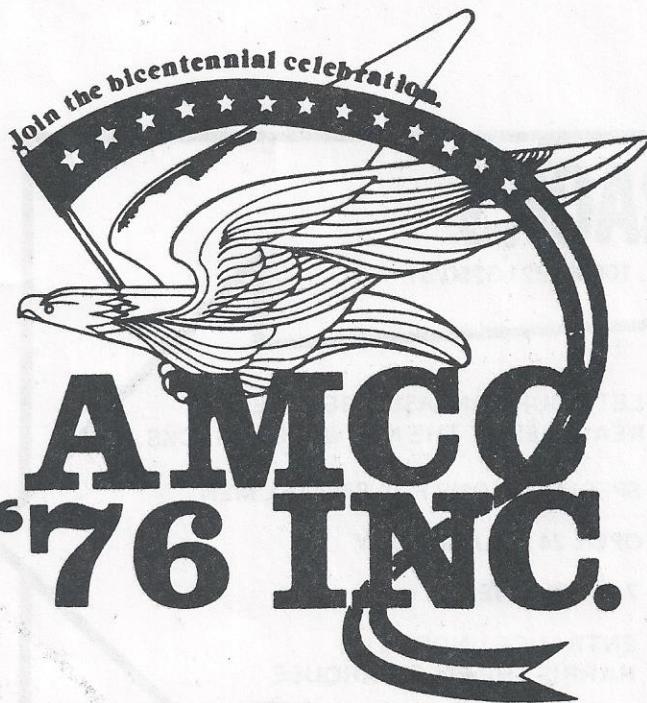

MEDICAL TIPDennis B.

During the past couple of months quite a few club members have approached me with questions relating to venereal disease. I will take this opportunity to answer some of the questions.

Although there are twelve diseases classified as being venereal disease, the two most frequently seen are gonorrhea and syphilis. Gonorrhea is characterized by the showing of a yellowish discharge 3-5 days after a contact has been made. Also, urination will be difficult, painful, and cause a burning sensation when the disease process is present in the penis. Rectal gonorrhea is less defined and may show no symptoms at all.

Syphilis, although not as prominent as gonorrhea, has reached the epidemic stage in society today. Symptoms vary and frequently are not present at all.

Classically, if syphilis has been contracted, a person would usually experience the observation at the point of contact, of a small painless sore (resembling a cold sore) called a cancre. Also, a victim may experience a night of chills, fever, sore throat, a runny nose or appearance of a rash that does not itch. However, as I said many times, no symptoms present themselves, and the only way a person could be aware if the disease process were present would be by serology examination (blood test).

If you are having multiple contacts, it is vital to your own well-being and those people you come in sexual contact with, to develop a program of care. Remember, it only takes one contact to develop symptoms.

So what I suggest is that every three months, have a blood specimen (serology) drawn. If you have a doctor who is aware of venereal disease, you could follow through your self-care program through him. However, many physicians do not deal with venereal disease that frequently and may not have the expertise that you would encounter at a clinic.

Although many people freak out at the thought of presenting themselves at a clinic, this is where you will receive the best care and diagnosis. The State of Massachusetts has clinics set up in a number of hospitals, most commonly as part of their Dermatology Clinic. All patients at the clinic are treated with confidentiality and they are there for the purpose of treating you free of charge.

If you would prefer private treatment through a physician you can call one of the clinics mentioned and they will give you a list of physicians who would be able to treat you.

One other problem that has developed that I think is worth mentioning is this: If you have an open cut anywhere on your hands, do not engage in fist-fucking. A common organism of the rectum, i.e. coli, can cause blood poisoning when it comes in contact with an open wound. If this has occurred, the wound will become inflamed and will be painful. Once into the blood stream, it will present itself as a red line along a vein tract (phlebitis) which is extremely painful and dangerous. If this symptom presents itself, medical care must be immediate!

I have written this article, as I said, because many people have asked me a lot of questions and as an RN, it is easier for me to answer them through the NOUS LETTRE. I hope the information is clear and concise.

PART 11 CREATING THE SCENE

In the last issue we talked about the s&m scene as it relates to your own sexual awareness both physically and mentally. Having identified yourself with a particular preference, you are now ready to find out what it's all about.

If you are out on the loose seeking a confident 's' with all the attributes, then be expected as an 'm' to make your last decision with no second thoughts. Case in point: I met this good-looking dude at an L/L bar one night. We were obviously attracted to each other. I was in a strange mood, looking for dominance in a wild way. I noticed this guy was wearing his keys on his left side, his eyes were locked onto mine and a faint but luring smile crossed his lips. By some sense of a good vibration, I went up to him and said hello. The conversation was direct and short enough to figure out what we both wanted to get into. And then, with all the steadfast confidence in a manner which caught me completely off guard, he said "if you choose to go home with me, it will be the last decision you'll make for the rest of the night." My keys were on the left side as well. He noticed them and immediately switched them to my right side and said, "well?" It was like a hypnotic suggestion. I made the decision and it was, in fact, the last decision I made until he made me reach what he considered to be my limit of tolerance in an s&m scene.

The encounter at the bar was brief and direct. He knew what he wanted and didn't let loose on his control one iota, and it was that way throughout the scene with no apologies. And, it was quite apparent to him, that I expected firm treatment and sexual discipline.

After the first session, the next few meetings brought out new experiments in various degrees of tolerance. From it, I developed a confident awareness unknown to me before. Like

anything else, you can only learn by actual experience so that now, when I walk about with keys on the left, it's for a purpose and willing 'm's' know to expect the unexpected.

Creating the scene from an 's' point of view requires imagination with firm control. Case in point: I brought one guy to my place, had a few beers to relax. With every firmness of my mind and voice, I ordered him to strip. He casually removed his clothes which was not fast enough for me. I quickly grabbed the back of his head by the hair and told him to hurry up. He had scattered his clothes on the floor. He was ordered to pick them up, fold them and place them in outstretched hands before me. This he did, but I wanted to further test his obedience. I grabbed his neatly folded levis and dropped them to his feet and ordered him to repeat the procedure. It was done quicker this time and he was told to place them aside.

After an interesting evening, he was about to depart. He remarked how he was able to find his levis neatly in place. I told him there was a purpose for everything, that I also took charge of every matter without question. He said "thank you." With that I grabbed the locks of his hair to see his face wince with obvious discomfort, and I said, "you forgot to finish your sentence." He quickly remembered and replied, "sir." He was told that in another session forgetfulness would bring on stronger discipline.

Firm control must be understood from the start. A good 'm' does not move one inch nor is he allowed to do anything without permission. He is told that his mind and body is entrusted to his master. His eyes are always down-cast, his head bent forward. Words of humiliation will make him understand his place in an s&m relationship. Infliction of physical pain and abuse should be administered as a reprimand when your 'm' is not doing what he is told.

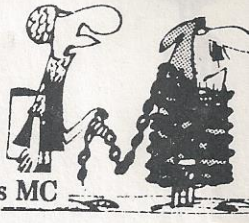

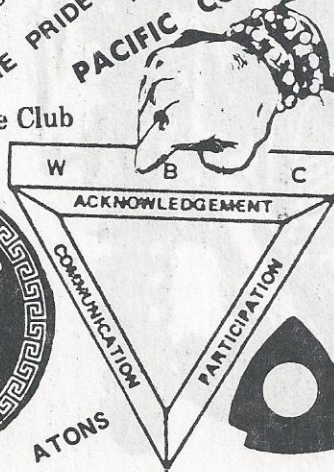

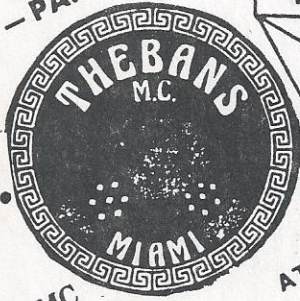
