A great deal of effort goes into dressing up the overlay. The sleeveless piece of denim becomes ones walking papers among the club scene. Every practical inch is bedecked with run pins, patches of every size and shape, pendants with minature chain, name tags, a few studs here and there, not to mention the embroidered stitching to identify one's club - all that jazz makes up the standard overlay; to be worn at every club event, meeting, etc, etc.

But is it? We've gone through all the trouble to attend several runs, afford the traveling and run fees, willing to participate and work for a pin or patch, yet we forsake the overlay and fail to wear it at every opportunity.

It is all to easy to forget why it's important to wear the club colors. As noted in another leather magazine, some travelers arrived in Boston recently and found no one in any club overlays.

Let's restore pride in our club and ourselves as members. It's all a part of paying dues, going to meetings and wanting to belong to a fraternity. Wear that overlay when you can, not just to meetings but whenever you go to your favorite watering hole, or when you travel to another region. It just might be your ticket for more friendships and, in some cases, save your life. The club scene ought to be a particular group of guys who all share that pride. The overlay tells all. It took a lot of work to make it.



TRADE WINDS of CHICAGO, INC. was founded on February 14, 1975 at a meeting of seven people at the home of Paul W., its first Captain. Five of the seven members in attendance chose to organize and become charter members of TRADE WINDS.

One week later in Kansas City, Mo. we were nominated by the WRANGLER MC and by the SELECTMEN of Dallas and Detroit, respectively and unanimously voted the 19th member of the mid-America Conference of Clubs, Inc.

TRADE WINDS was founded on the basis of leather/levi and participation with strong encouragement of its members to purchase motorcycles in the future. However, the Club has a strong feeling and wish to remain a leather/levi, social club and not to exclude our brothers from membership on the inability to ride a bike or to afford to own one.

TRADE WINDS became Chicago's 6th club and the first leather/levi, social club. One of our proudest achievements to date is to have never infringed on other Chicago clubs membership. All of our members were once independents; not one of them has ever belonged to another club.

This year we will be holding our 2nd Annual Road Rally & Olympic Games. This is a one-day event officially but the related social activities start on Friday night and end Sunday, October 1-3, 1976. The cost is \$10.00 oer person which covers entry in the automobile road rally and bike events and/or individual competition. Three meals, beer, soda, trophies and medals are all part of this one-day event.

Our achievements in our short time in existence are many for our small but enthusiastic membership. We have been presented the banners of the following: SELECTMEN, CHICAGO KNIGHTS MC, T.S.M.C. and the KNIGHTS OF OMAHA MC. We hold seven trophies for participation at various runs. We are presently twelvemembers strong and have two honorary members and thirty-five associates.

Our home bar, the Virgo Out in Chicago is also the official club address: 2546 N. Clark St., Chicago, Ill. 60614. It is owned by our Club treasurer, Wally T. and an honorary member, Fred W.

TRADE WINDS was one of the founding members of the Chicago Conference of Clubs. We are presently Chicago's second largest club and proud to be part of the club brotherhood. We have proudly presented our club banner to the SELECTMEN, CHICAGO KNIGHTS MC. The help and brotherhood extended our club by the other Chicago clubs and member clubs in our Conference has made me very proud to be one of the charter members and Captain of the TRADE WINDS.

"Schnapps for my American friends" were set up frequently. Her car was made available for tours of Bavaria. In short, Gusti did everything possible to make the visit a success.




