ENTRE NOUS observes its Sixth Anniversary during the Province-town '76 Run with approximately 175 club members and independents taking part in the weekend festivities. The Club was founded on

September 9, 1970 by a handful of spirited individuals with a common bond for brotherhood. Mike Cain, now Captain Emeritus, served as the club's captain to 1974, then succeeded by Joe Kirby until 1976. ENTRE NOUS was incorporated on July 15, 1976. Joe has the distinction of being the club's first president under the Corporation.

Today ENTRE NOUS has approximately 45 active members and over 100 associates throughout the U.S., Canada and Europe. Some 22 clubs throughout the country have presented their colours to ENTRE NOUS (listed elsewhere in this issue) down through its six-year history.

ENTRE NOUS is actively engaged in fund-raising projects for worthwhile charitable programs. To this end, the Speaker of the House of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts cited ENTRE NOUS in 1975 for its outstanding contributions through several greater Boston community agencies inspired by the Hon. Elaine Noble, who is an Honorary Member of the Club.

Provincetown provides the natural setting for the Sixth Anniversary celebration, especially during the American Bicentennial Year. It was in this quaint and rustic fishing village where the Pilgrims first landed and signed the Mayflower Compact, the first document in the western hemosphere to give birth to American democracy. It was also here

not so long ago when the Provincetown Board of Selectmen endorsed gay rights legislation. It is a unique community of many life styles. The various townspeople and businessmen have made it possible for ENTRE NOUS and its guests to enjoy this weekend anniversary observance. The Provincetown '76 Run Committee is congratulated for every effort into the making of a successful run.

Club Night


The success of Club Night is attributed to the efforts of Ed R. and Dennis B., the road captain and assistant road captain, respectively.
