The time is ideal where several members are either associates or honorary members of other clubs, for the respective club leaders to come together and meet to discuss future projects and ideas for the betterment of all members in the scene. We see a loose affiliation in the making where cooperation and assistance between all New England clubs is possible without an AMCC-type formality. Like puberty, you must have suffered enough through the rejection syndrome. Assert yourself and make the move. If you want him, go after it. The ache in your loins tells you that you need some good action.

The Spike is generally good and you should have no problem meeting the guy who is equally turned on to you. If not, it's still early by New York

You'll find other eager young guys waiting for water sports activity. The enticement is heightened especially when the bartender makes the announcement,

"gentlemen, this man kneeling in front of the bar has had 21 piss loads and is still thirsty. A free beer to anyone stepping up to the bar and accommodating him." Needless to say, plenty of beer is either given away or sold at the Mine Shaft.

Down below in the depths of the shaft staircase, there is plenty of activity going on. Several groups of orgies are really getting into it. You become aroused when a smiling blue-eyed tall guy stops to encourage your moves, especially if he's clad in a jock strap, a hard hat, and construction boots. A snort of poppers and you're in tune for whatever happens.

Of course if your into groups and different erotic trips as a result of light or heavy S&M, the Mine Shaft is a great place and perhaps addictive if you want to make it there two nights in a row. However, if you're a one to one person and want to enjoy your own scene in private, the Mine Shaft is a great place to meet someone with like interests

The AMCC affair is, indeed, not a dead issue nor should we stick our heads in the sand and pretend its non-existence. Norman O.'s comments in last month's issue of WHEELS MAGAZINE illustrated some excellent points. In essence, there is a possibility for dialogue with fresh meaning and purpose of an AMCC or an equivalent type organization. A fresher approach to new guidelines while respecting the rights, privileges and sovereignty of each club is very possible. At least, ENTRE NOUS should be ready for it. The desire and motivation is there for the other area clubs to get together and discuss the overall situation. Pretty soon, we can expect our door to be knocked upon for inclusion in any discussion toward newer solutions to the AMCC and possible re-admittance into that organization. ENTRE NOUS is on record at considering its membership when new rules and regulations could be made within the AMCC. It did so in its letter when the Club resigned its membership from the Council.

ENTRE NOUS should be ready for discussion taking into consideration new articles of agreement, run date co-ordinating, and our relationship geographically with other clubs. As stated in our editorial, we see some positive steps being made between the New England clubs for closer ties and more harmony. The climate is ripe for discussion....and frankly, I'm willing to participate in some preliminary meeting of club minds.
