Mr. Boston Leather 2004

I wanted to take a minute and write a note about my year as Mr. Boston Leather 2004 and share it with you. It was an experience I will never forget. For those who know me, you know I have a very strong spiritual side to myself. But also, the journey into leather and the journey of my spiritual side have gone hand in hand. This past year was no exception.

There are some in the community who see title holders as leaders. But are title holder's leaders? If so, who do they lead if everybody doesn't see them as leaders? In preparing for the Mr. Boston contest I thought about this question and I came up with this option. My thoughts were that leather title holders were not leaders because the general public does not vote on anybody to have this title. Just a few well appointed people. Well, one of the reasons I wanted to run for this title was to show what I thought a title holder should do. So in a way I do lead... I lead by example. One of the reasons I wanted this title to accomplish what I wanted to do for my community. I didn't need the title to do those things, but has been a useful tool for me to accomplish my goals. Growing up my parents taught us the importance of community

One of those great people, recently has met with some health issues, and is now waiting on an organ transplant. If you are not already an organ donor I strongly encourage you to become one today by visiting www.organdonor.gov, and fill out a card. By becoming an organ donor you can give someone a new lease on life.

For years coming to the Mr. Boston contest I heard many of the other men who held this title on how the experience of competing at IML was this amazing, life changing experience, and well, nousey me had to go and find out what it was about. It was every bit the amazing experience they talked about. To coin a phrase on IML, it was like leatherman boot camp. Meeting 56 other men from all over the world, and experience what is known as the International Mr. Leather Competition. With the other men I competed with, no matter where we are, or how much time has past, we will always have this experience that will always bind us.

In closing, I would like to say how truly honored I am to have represented the New England Leather community in 2004.

As noted in another leather magazine, some travelers arrived in Boston recently and found no one in any club overlays.



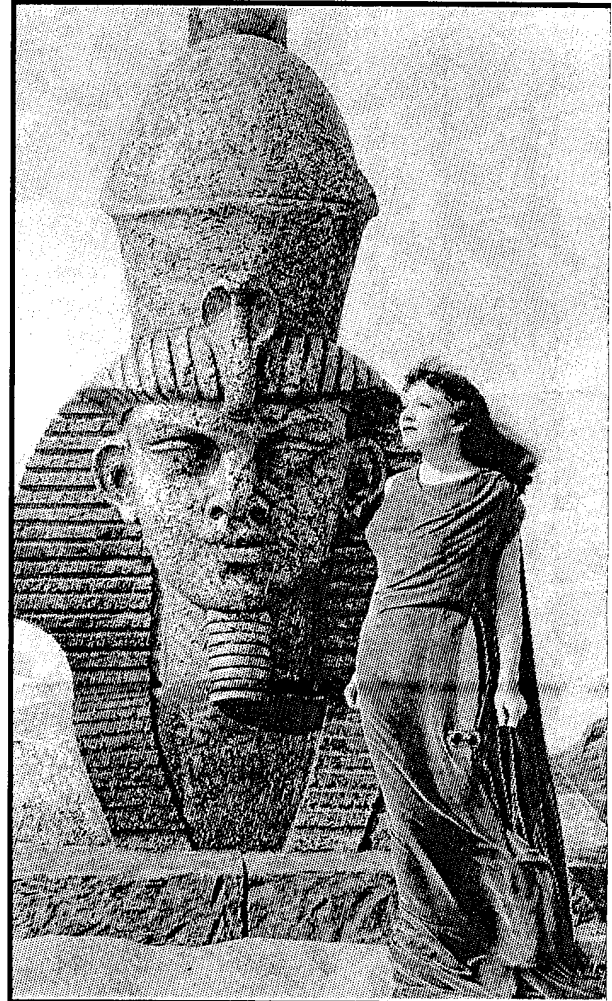

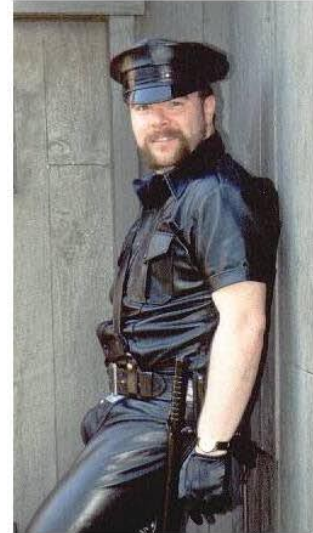
