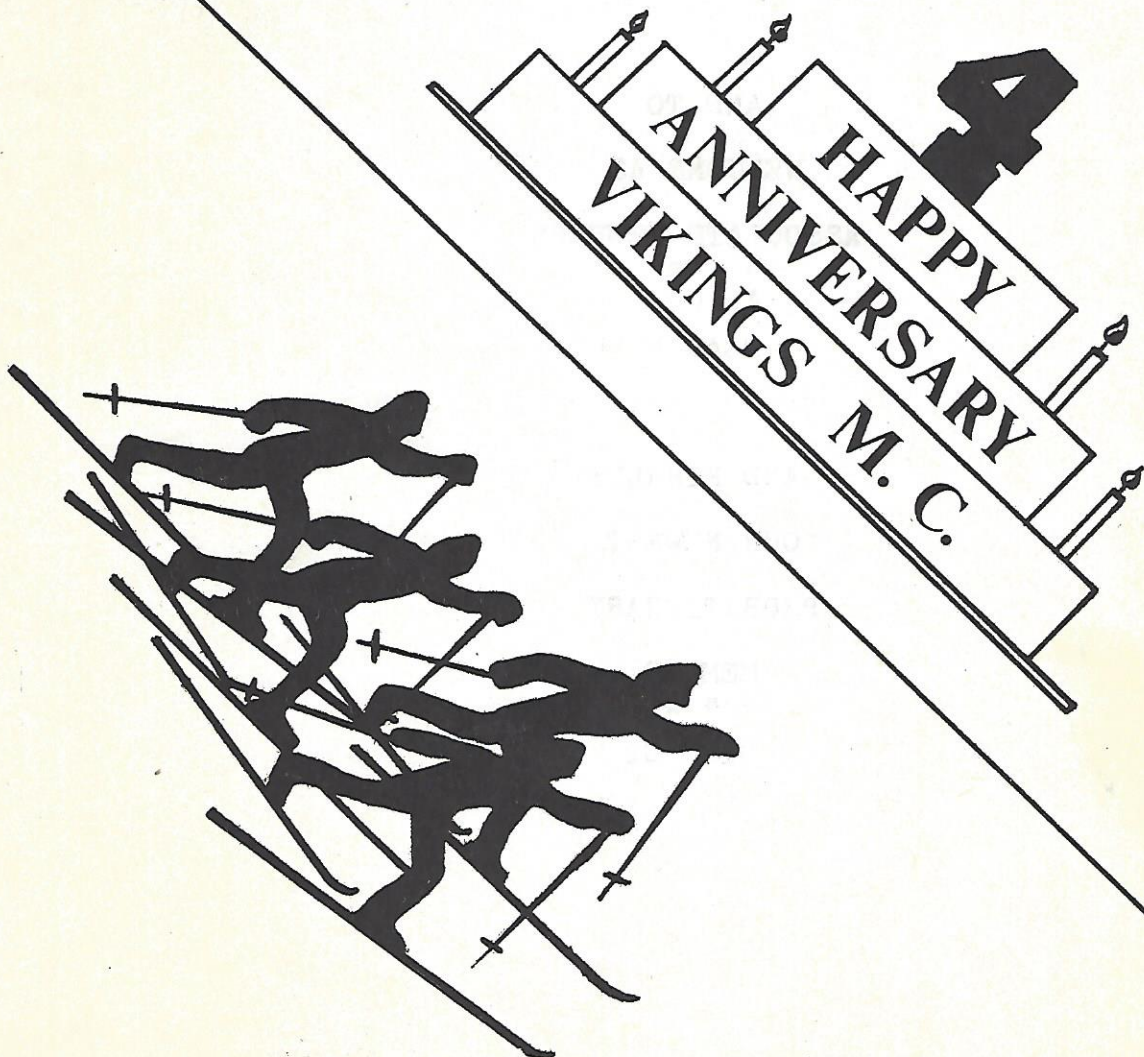

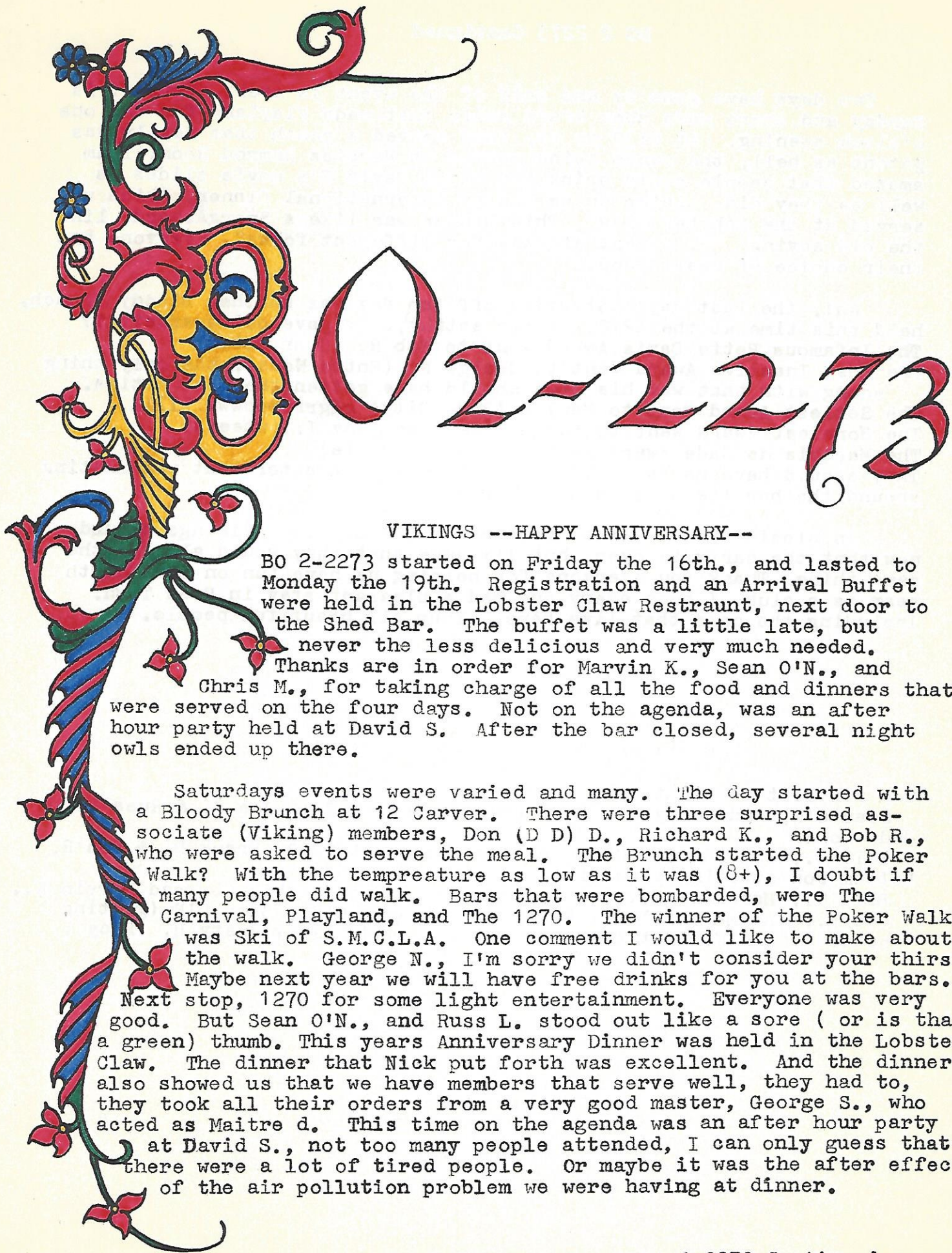

A Prior Letter from Your Master at Arms

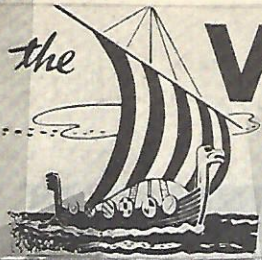

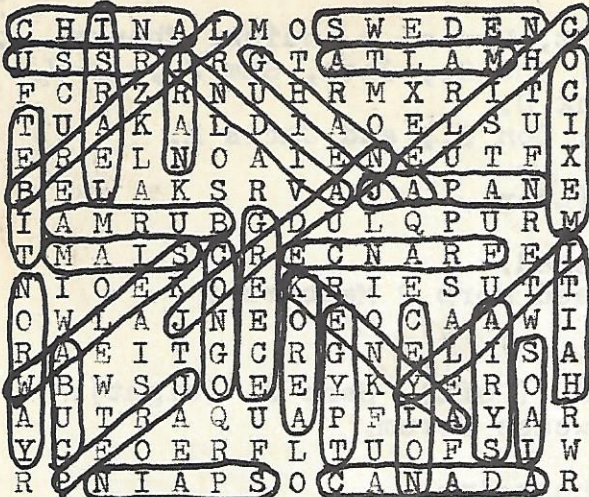

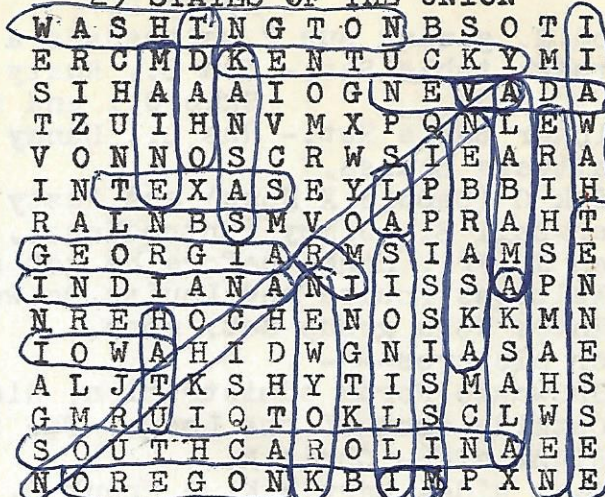
Vikings on Skis (Cont.)

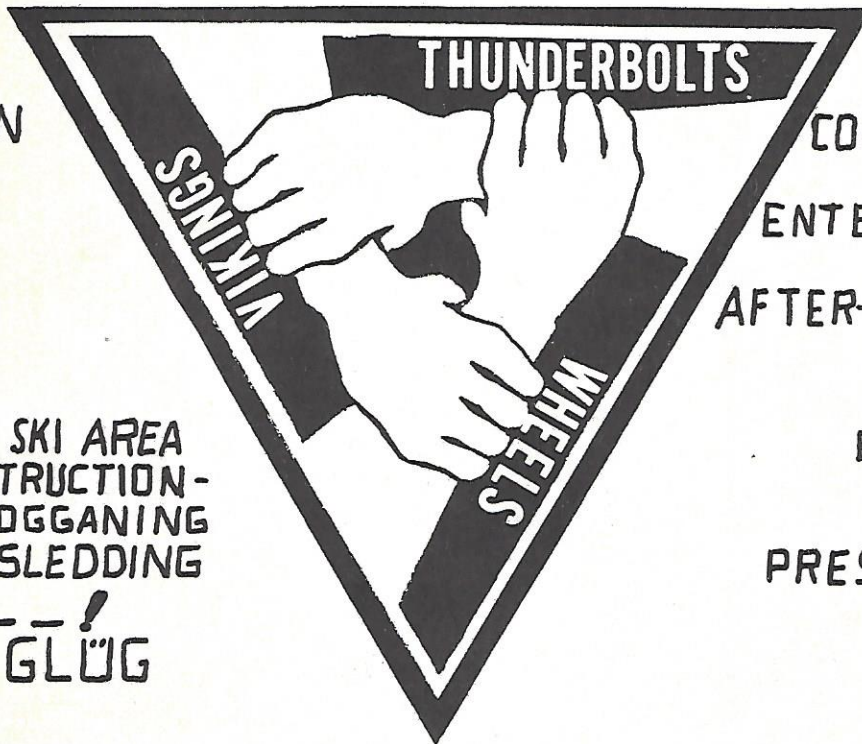

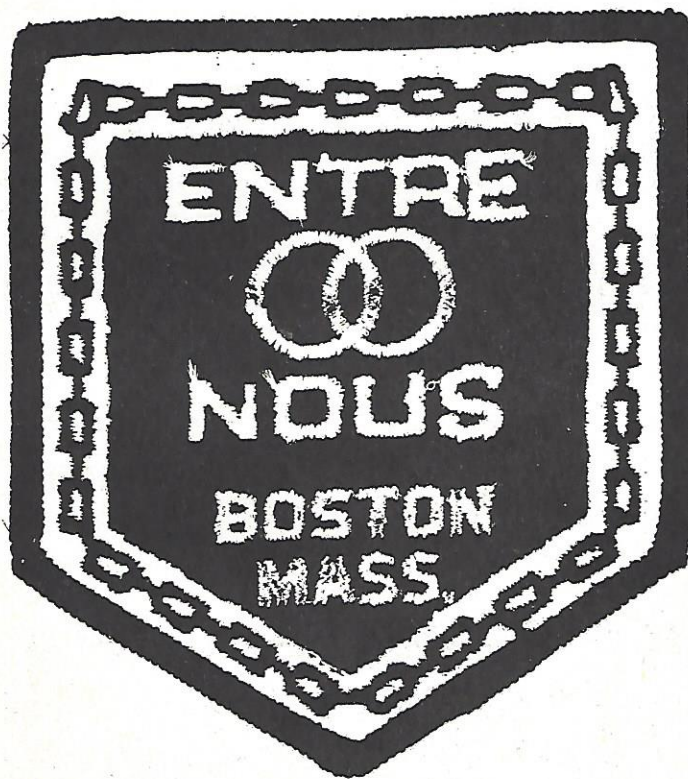
