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SPEARHEAD CHARITY OF CHOICE SELECTION

At the January OGM, we had a presentation from PWA to be considered for our Charity of Choice for 2020. The board also had interest from 2 other organizations that unfortunately do to scheduling conflicts were not able to send a representative to the OGM but we felt still warranted consideration from the membership



The prevalence of poverty among those living with HIV/ AIDS is staggering: an estimated 60% of people living with HIV/AIDS have an annual income under \$20,000 with 45% living on less than \$12,000 a year (Canadian AIDS Society, Force for Change). Many simply cannot afford to eat the proper food their bodies need. When hunger and malnutrition occur a great preventative opportunity is lost; malnutrition increases the risk of AIDS -related illnesses. A person can stay healthy so long as they can afford to eat properly.

The Toronto People With AIDS Foundation's Food Program components form a food security model; both are emergency based food services with the goal to promote the health, dignity and independence of all people living with HIV/AIDS in Toronto by increasing access to affordable, nutritious and culturally appropriate foods.

WE OFFER THE ONLY FOOD BANK AND MEAL DELIVERY PROGRAM TO EXCLUSIVELY SERVE PEOPLE LIVING WITH HIV/AIDS IN TORONTO.

ESSENTIALS MARKET

- While gay men continue to be our largest client population, people living with HIV/AIDS from countries where HIV is endemic, including women, comprise our fastest growing client population.
- Immigrants, refugees and non-status people now make up 40% of the people who access our food bank.
- Two thirds of the people we serve are single and 25% of people in need of assistance for food security are female and mothers of small children.
- The program also has 25 dedicated volunteers who donate several hundred hours of their time each month to the program.
- The food bank is open every Wednesday and Thursday from 12pm – 7pm. To enhance accessibility, emergency services are available any time during PWA's office hours.

FOOD FOR LIFE

- Food For Life program helps alleviate the devastating effect of this reality by providing nutritious meals.
 - The mission is to enhance the health and well-

being of people living with HIV/AIDS who cannot shop and prepare their own meals.

- •Long-term survivors of HIV are the largest group of people served by Food For Life.
- •Volunteers, most of who are HIV positive, deliver Food For Life meals to those who require home delivery, offering social contact with someone who understands what they are going through.
- •Our Food for Life Coordinator regularly meets and talks with participants to monitor their health, progress and satisfaction

IMPACT

PWA's success of its community involvement is the strong partnerships with organizations who give of their time and fundraising efforts to enable PWA to continue with its programs and services. Throughout the years we have been blessed with the support and generosity of Spearhead who continue to make PWA a large part of their community outreach. In addition to the essential funds raised, it's important to acknowledge the impact that Spearhead has had on the community. Living with HIV/AIDS often results in isolation and losing your connection to community. The support network that some find through community impacts overall health and well-being in a profound manner. Many of our clients choose to volunteer with PWA and/or join community groups like Spearhead that will help them to feel connected, less alone and able to give back.

We hope that you will consider us as your charity of choice for 2020. Below, I have included a story written by one of our youth about her experience growing up with The Teresa Group having her back.

Thank you for your consideration and all of the incredible work you do in the community!

Part of my life - Abigail

I don't remember the first time I came to The Teresa Group, and I don't know if I can nail down exactly when it became such an important part of my life, but I know it has always been there.

My mom and I came to Canada when I was a baby. We were refugees. She was grateful to be here, but she was still a young mother with a new baby and felt scared and alone in this new place.

This is where The Teresa Group entered our lives. The SickKids Hospital clinic sent us there, telling my mother that she would be able to find help and friends. She started coming to a support group with other moms every month. The women she met here are still her best friends. They lifted her up and supported her when she needed it, and eventually she was able to do the same for them.

I think I was around five when I start to have memories of coming in to The Teresa Group, nothing solid, but I can picture the space and the toys, the faces happy to see me. I still didn't understand anything, but I knew when we came to that building, I was going to have some fun. I went to my first group when I was 7, of course I didn't really know it was group, it was just a fun thing I got to do on Saturdays. Looking back now, I can see all the sneaky therapy type things we did. Learning how to recognize and express our emotions, understanding our friends' emotions, how to be a good friend, teamwork – all hidden in games and activities. Very sneaky. thing that had been a huge part of my life without me knowing it. We were both HIV positive. My mind was blown, but I felt kind of dumb too. How did I not already know this? I had been taking medication all of my life, why didn't I ask more questions about why? Why hadn't I found it weird that we both take pills every day? Then, I started to see how she had been preparing me for this. I didn't need to ask her what HIV was, because we had talked about it before. I knew about how medications had changed, and people lived long lives with HIV, I understood stigma (as much as a 12-year-old can), my mom had been laying the ground for this conversation for over a year.

She told me later that The Teresa Group was a place we went to because they support families with HIV. It was her social worker there who had been the one to help her through telling me and preparing her to be ready for any kind of reaction (apparently tweens are unpredictable, who knew). It took a little while for us to find our footing again, but my mom and I are a team, and we got there.

What now though? I still had a lot of feelings I wasn't quite sure what to do with, and I really wasn't sure I wanted to tell anyone what I had learned. Once again, The Teresa Group stepped in to help me through. That summer I attended my first Summer Camp, and later on I attended the "Leading the Way" groups. Meeting other kids my age going through the same thing was such a big first step to accepting this news.

Six years later, I am thankful every day that The Teresa Group was there for me and my mom. It scares me a bit to think about how we would have gotten through if they hadn't been there. I know we wouldn't have our incredible extended family and this incredible safe place that welcomed us so long ago.





Fabulosa! The story of Polari, Britain's secret gay Language By Paul Baker ISBN: 978-1-78914-132-0 320pgs



My first exposure to the language was during a documentary being shown at Harbourfront about the work of Bruce Eves. My first reaction was Pol what?

At that time I knew nothing of its history or how it was correctly used. I did know that from the 1940s to the mid- 1970s that being gay was nowhere near as open as the Toronto of the late 1980s. During that time you could still be arrested or hospitalized.

The book takes you on a journey that looks at the language's roots and where it was most widely spoken. I can see why it was created since it was a way to communicate with others and if you were lucky, get laid.

As to its decline in use is mainly down to the 1967 decriminalization of Homosexuality and frankly Ageism. Thanks to the author's work the language has seen a resurgence to such a point that a chapter of the Sisters of Perpetual Indulgence translating the Bible into High Polari.

I highly doubt that you will be hearing Polari in Canada anytime soon. It would be rather funny if we did. Imagine being told the following: I had bevies at the Bird where all the butch omees were either on their Polari pipes or ogled the vardavision to see seaweed nosh or clean the kitchen.

I highly recommend the book.

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PEPE'S OPEN KITCHEN



Recipe

Banana Cake

I ngredients

- 2 cups whole wheat flour
- ¼ teaspoon of salt
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- ³/₄ cup of honey
- ½ cup of sugar free apple sauce
- 2 eggs beaten
- 3 very ripe bananas mashed

I nstructions

- 1. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees Fahrenheit and grease a 9" x 5" loaf pan
- 2. In a large bowl mix the flour, salt and baking soda (set aside)
- 3. In another bowl mix the honey, sugar free apple sauce, eggs and mashed bananas
- 4. Add flower mixture and stir to combine
- 5. Pour the batter into your greased loaf pan. Bake for 60 to 65 minutes, or until a toothpick inserted into the enter comes out clean.
- 6. Place the pan on a cooling rack and let the cake cool completely.

Recipe Special Mayonnaise Cake

I ngredients

- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 cup granulated sugar
- 3 tablespoons of cocoa
 powder

1 teaspoon baking soda

- ½ teaspoon salt
- 1 cup water
- 1 cup mayonnaise
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract



I nstructions

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees Fahrenheit and Grease a 9x5 inch loaf pan.
- 2. Mix dry ingredients together in medium mixing bowl. Add the water, mayonnaise, and vanilla and mix until evenly combined. Pour batter into prepared baking pan. Bake for 60-65 minutes or until toothpick comes out clean.


